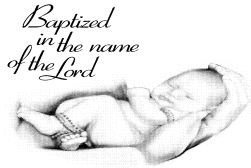


Morning Fellowship Join us in the Christian Family Life Center after our 8:20 service for a fresh cup of coffee and fellowship.

Building News

Gifts – Thank you for gifts of \$5,389.71 last Sunday for the building Fund. Of this amount, \$100.00 was designated for the Elevator Fund, \$2,129.71 for Debt Retirement, and \$50.00 for the Flag Pole Project. At the end of each month, we will pay extra advanced payments as gifts provide.

- Included in the Debt Retirement gifts was the entire principal payment for payment # 25.
- The Flag Pole will be placed in the Grace Plaza. This will take place in the spring with a



dedication planned for June 12, the Day of Pentecost.

Bank West Short-term Loan of \$56,000 has now been paid off and we did shred the note last Sunday. Thank you so much.

Q. Will our Building Fund Account remain open?

A. Yes!

Q. Why?

A. Well that is an easy answer. The Building/Debt Account will remain open for three reasons.

1. It is now also our **Elevator Account**. The cost of an Elevator is about \$50,000. It will need to be installed before we can finish the second floor.

2. **Debt Retirement**. As we are able, with additional gifts designated for Debt Retirement, we wish to make accelerated debt Principal payments. There are huge savings on the front side of our Church Extension Fund loan if we can make additional payments on the \$1,000,000 loan.

Through gifts from the parish and memorials given we will have already, as of February 1st, made 15 advanced payments saving \$70,909.32. In a future newsletter, we will show the next 12 payments reflecting on what is interest and Principal.

3. **Projects** – We still have things we want to pick away at. For example – when we worked at cleaning the Luke, John, and Paul rooms and sealing floors we used up the extra insulation left over from insulating the hallway wall upstairs and the St. Mark room. Norm Neilan graciously insulated the room side walls of the hallway in Luke, John, and Paul. We now wish to cover that exposed insulation with half-inch sheet rock up to eight foot, for now, in those three rooms. We will have a work morning on Saturday, February 19 from 9:00-12:00 to accomplish this task. So gifts for the Building Fund are still needed and appreciated.

We have also permanently mounted the thermostat in Luke/John and balanced the air flow in Mark/Matthew. These expenses are also billed to the Building Fund.

Envelopes You now have in your 2011 Envelopes a Debt Retirement Envelope. We will also continue to send, starting in March again, a Building Fund Envelope that you can use for Debt Retirement, Elevator Fund, or the Building Fund as God blesses you with the ability to help in these areas.

When the Debt Retirement envelope in your packets is used, unless otherwise designated, it will be used toward advanced payments on our Church Extension Fund loan. On the front side of this loan, large interest savings are made with advanced payments.

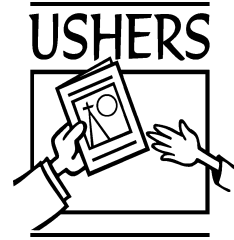
The Yellow Line So what is that yellow rectangle in the Christian Family Life Center? That is

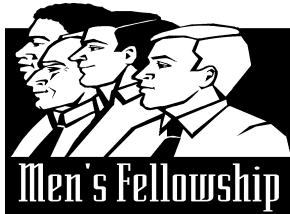

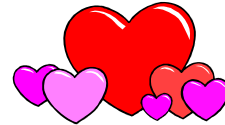

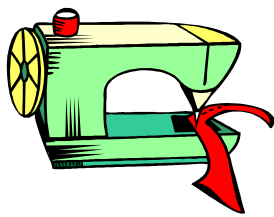
