

"Rider" Pastor Sam Handschke (Mark 11:1-10)



CHRISTMAS EVE WORSHIP

Our Christmas Eve services will look a little different this year. In an effort to keep our members as safe and comfortable as possible, we are **increasing the number of services on Christmas Eve.** This will not only give our members increased options about the time of day that they worship but it will also allow us to keep the total number of worshippers low enough to allow social distancing between groups.

Christmas Eve services will be held at: 11:00AM, 2:00PM, 5:00PM, and 7:30PM

In order to ensure that each service has an appropriate number of worshippers, we are asking that **each member would sign-up for a specific service time**. This can be done online by visiting our website or by phone (calling the church office). When a specific service time is full, we would ask that our members choose another time. This helps us to keep our members spaced apart and as safe as possible.

For those who prefer to worship at home, we will be live-streaming our 5:00 service. You can join us online during that service (just like Sunday morning), or you can view the service later during the day. This is a wonderful opportunity for all of our members to join together, either electronically or physically, to remember and celebrate the birth of our Savior. Please wisely consider which of these options you may want to use.
