

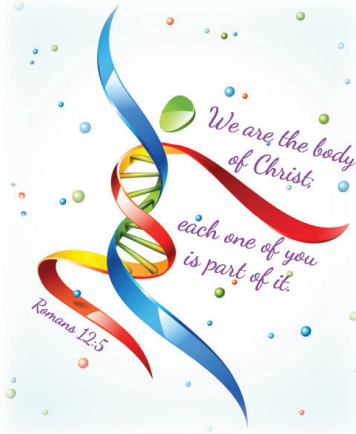

We will have two projects for our Gifts from the Heart. If you wish, you may furnish material for the backing of larger quilts in WHITE or OFF-WHITE only. The wider backing is made in either 90" or 108" widths. You would buy 2 1/2 yards of either width. They can also use the 3000 yard cone thread in

white, off-white, or light tan colors.

The second project is items for the Pierre Food pantry. You may purchase non-perishable food items and paper products for the Pierre Food Pantry.
