Lift up your heads, ye mighty gates! Behold, the King of glory waits.

- P On this fourth Sunday in Advent we light a candle and call it Life.
(The acolyte lights three purple candles and one pink candle.)
- P When we were slaves to sin—
- C **Those things resulted in death.**
- P But now that we have been set free from sin—
- C **The result is eternal life.**
- P For the wages of sin is death.
- C **But the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord!**

Fling wide the portals of your heart; make it a temple set apart
From earthly use for heav'n's employ, adorned with prayer and love and joy.
So shall your Sov'reign enter in and new and nobler life begin.
To God alone be praise for word and deed and grace!

To Christ the Savior raise your grateful hymns of praise. For the wages of sin is death.

BUILDING NEWS




Thank you for your continued gifts to our Building Fund – We thank you for your gifts last Sunday to the Building Fund of \$1,440.00. The gifts were designated as follows:

Debt Retirement Thanks to your generosity we have been able to send in two additional payments with our regular December payment. Thus far we have made 168 additional payments which have saved us \$565,266.63 in interest. Our current balance is \$360,293.53.

Debt Retirement Challenge A generous family of our Faith congregation has graciously offered to match up to \$10,000.00 for Debt Retirement.
