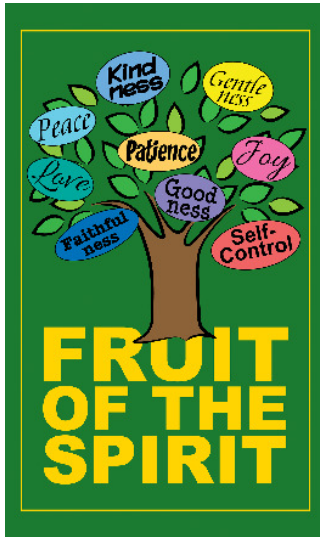

SERIES THEME: The Fruit of the Spirit

The services from The Baptism of Our Lord (January 8) through Transfiguration (February 26) are tied together by the theme “The Fruit of the Spirit” from Galatians 5:22–23. Each Sunday focuses on a different fruit.

THE OPENING SENTENCES *Galatians 5:22–23; 1 Corinthians 3:16; 1 John 3:1a*

P The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. Do you not know that you are God’s temple and that God’s Spirit dwells in you?

C See what kind of love the Father has given to us that we should be called children of God; and so we are.

THE CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION *1 Corinthians 6:19–20a*

P Let us go to our loving Father, confident of His forgiveness for Jesus' sake.

Silence for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination

P Heavenly Father,

C we confess that we are by nature sinful and unclean. We have failed to exhibit love, the fruit of Your Holy Spirit, in our thinking, speaking, and acting. We have not loved You completely or our neighbors as ourselves. We have let hatred mask the love You have shown us. We have failed to live as brothers and sisters of Your beloved Son. Our Lord Jesus revealed His person and ministry through His words and actions. In Your great mercy, forgive, renew, and lead us so that we may be revealed as His faith-filled followers to the glory of Your holy name. Amen.

P “Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price.” Almighty God in His mercy has given His Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ☩ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

THEME CELEBRATION “Love” *Galatians 5:22; John 13:34*

P In chapter five of Paul's Letter to the Galatians, he calls upon Christians to “walk by the Spirit.” After listing the negative characteristics he calls the “works of the flesh,” Paul writes a second list, in which he describes what they are to show forth as “the fruit of the Spirit.”

Reader: *The first fruit of the Spirit listed by Paul is love. The work of the Spirit in the life of the follower of Jesus Christ is love that reflects His self-giving love for us. In the Upper Room in Jerusalem, after washing the disciples' feet, Jesus said, “A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another.”*

THE COLLECT

Father in heaven, throughout His earthly ministry, Jesus revealed His identity and mission through words and deeds. Grant that Your Holy Spirit strengthen us so that we may be revealed as His faith-filled followers as we demonstrate the Spirit’s fruit of love in what we say and do; through Your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

THE OLD TESTAMENT *Isaiah 42:1–9* (God will put His Spirit on His chosen servant.)

Lector: Jesus was revealed to be God’s unique, Spirit-filled servant, and we are revealed as His followers through the fruit of the Spirit. The prophecy was written in psalm-like poetry. Let us read the covenant charge responsively in one another’s hearing:

Behold My servant, whom I uphold, My chosen, in whom My soul delights;
I have put My Spirit upon Him;

Left side: He will bring forth justice to the nations.

Right side: He will not cry aloud or lift up His voice,

Left side: or make it heard in the street;
a bruised reed He will not break,
Right side: and a faintly burning wick He will not quench;

Left side: He will faithfully bring forth justice.
Right side: He will not grow faint or be discouraged
till He has established justice in the earth;
and the coastlands wait for His law.

Lector: Thus says God, the LORD,
who created the heavens and stretched them out,
who spread out the earth and what comes from it,
who gives breath to the people on it and spirit to those who walk in it:
“I am the LORD; I have called You in righteousness;
I will take You by the hand and keep You;
I will give You as a covenant for the people, a light for the nations,

Left side: to open the eyes that are blind,
Right side: to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon,
from the prison those who sit in darkness.

Lector: I am the LORD; that is My name; My glory I give to no other,
nor My praise to carved idols. Behold, the former things have come to pass,
and new things I now declare; before they spring forth I tell you of them.”

Lector: This is the Word of the Lord.

C Thanks be to God.

THE EPISTLE LESSON *Romans 6:1–11 (Buried and raised with Christ, we walk in newness of life.)*

Lector 1: What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound?

Lector 2: *By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?*

Lector 1: We were buried therefore with Him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with Him in a death like His, we shall certainly be united with Him in a resurrection like His.

Lector 2: *We know that our old self was crucified with Him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. For one who has died has been set free from sin.*

Lector 1: Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with Him. We know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over Him.

Lector 2: *For the death He died He died to sin, once for all, but the life He lives He lives to God.*

Both lectors: So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

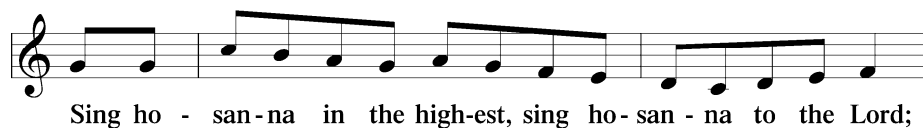

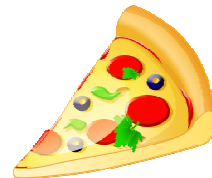
