

AS WE GATHER It would be a strange thing for God to send His Son to prepare the way of salvation for the world and then not give us a way to receive that salvation. “Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that He might bring us to God” (1 Peter 3:18). How does Jesus “bring us to God”? Peter says, “Baptism . . . now saves you” (1 Peter 3:21). Here is the most important way Jesus sends the Helper, the Holy Spirit, who works repentance and faith in the heart. Saving faith is not a product of our own effort, decision, or desire. It is always the gift of God, continually renewed

and strengthened by the Holy Spirit working through God’s Word and Sacraments. As our Easter celebration continues, we are drawn closer to our Lord, who remains close to us, as He said, “I am with you always” (Matthew 28:20).

Since Scripture teaches that those people who do not fully understand the meaning of this meal eat and drink to their own harm (1Cor. 11:27-29), and because the Lord's Supper is the supreme act of stating our unity in faith and doctrine, we would ask those people who are visiting with us to **please speak with one of our pastors**, before communing, in order that we might fulfill our responsibility of properly instructing people in the right use of the precious Sacrament.



Dave Anderson & Roger Walck Concert at Faith
Tuesday, May 23rd at 7:00 PM

Dave Anderson grew up as a Lutheran pastor's son in MN, SD, and WI. He attended Augustana Academy in Canton, SD; Augsburg College and the U of MN in Minneapolis. In 1963, Dave began a ministry which became known as Lutheran Youth Encounter, now known as Youth Encounter – today the largest Lutheran youth ministry in the world. In 1968, Dave became youth director at Central Lutheran, Van Nuys, CA; and, in 1969, began Lutheran Youth Alive which many described as “the Lutheran version of the Jesus Movement.”

In September, 1974, Dave left youth ministry and began to sing full-time. In November of that year, Dave and Barb were reunited after having lost track of each other for over nine years. They were married and from June, 1975, to November, 2010, they presented 5,250 concerts all over the world. Dave estimates that they flew 1 million miles and drove 2 million miles during those 35 ½ years.

Dave and Roger's music is a blend of contemporary, gospel, hymns, and lots of old-time Sunday school songs. The audience will be invited to sing along but, as Dave says, "so long as it's the same song." Dave Anderson comes from Phoenix, Arizona; and Roger and his wife, Patti, live in Corona, California.

Roger Walck is a skilled vocalist, guitarist, and a worship team leader. Roger is a graduate of Vanguard University and he has studied at Fuller Seminary and Azusa Pacific University. For many years, Roger taught theology at Orange Lutheran High School in Orange, California. For many years Roger has led Spanish-language worship in various Orange County churches.

Fellowship Ministries was the catalyst to help start the contemporary worship movement within the Lutheran denomination, publishing *The Other Songbook*, *The Best of the Best in Contemporary Praise & Worship*, and sponsoring over 250 worship and music conferences and seminars all over America and Australia.

In 1993, Dave, Barb, and five others survived a plane crash in the Bering Sea while returning from a mission in the Russian Far East. This incredible story has been told in a book and a documentary DVD called *The Rescue*, and the story has been heard and seen on radio and TV programs around the world.

Besides his music, the main focus of Dave's ministry is the Shepherd's Canyon Retreat ministry including the Development of *Standing Stones*, SCR's new retreat center.
