



AS WE GATHER Like a building, we have a foundation stone on which we rest, a cornerstone on which we build, a capstone that holds it all together. Those who reject His foundation, His cornerstone, and His capstone are broken into pieces in the Day of Judgment. All of this is revealed in the surprise of a parable about

Instead, they conspired to keep the vineyard as their own, rejected those whom the master sent, and killed his son. This is the story of Jesus and of the people of God that He had chosen and created to be His vineyard. It is a story of warning, but it is also a story of
