You might be surprised to hear, but I've had what I would call, some good "empty" moments this summer. Typically we think of emptiness as a bad thing, but it doesn't always have to be that way. What a joyous feeling it was when in July we made it to our Circuit Bible Camp campsite, and the trailer was completely empty from the kids taking all their gear out of it for us. Indeed, it was nice to see the trailer empty! An empty office is a good thing, because it means I'm out and about traveling to an LWML convention, with our youth, with the congregation, or going with family to some destination, or maybe even embarking on one of those world-famous South Dakota pheasant hunts we're so well known for. So there's certainly a number of good forms of "empty" I am refreshed to see and experience.

And yet in the Christian journey there are undoubtedly those moments when we feel empty and dried up. King David writes about this feeling in Psalm 22, which we also know to be Messianic in nature as it points us to Christ. King David writes; "My strength is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to my jaws; you lay me in the dust of

death."

Talk about being empty! Ultimately this Psalm points us to the One who was completely emptied for us. Jesus-His strength was emptied on the cross and through everything it took to march the hill known as The Place of the Skull to get there for us. He was laid in the dust of death for us. His dignity emptied for us. His life poured out and emptied all for us. For those days and moments when you feel completely hollowed out and empty, like you've got nothing left and emptier than ever—rest in the strength and promises of Christ that God will never leave you nor forsake you. Know that it was for you that the Son of God, Jesus Christ, was poured out unto death, poured out to fill you with God's incredible love that will carry you through even the darkest of days.

Christ transforms your emptiness into a vessel which brings God glory. On those hollow days, may your prayer to the Lord be especially meaningful and honest-may you fill someone else up—encourage, love, serve! In your baptism, you are filled with all the promises of Jesus Christ. Jesus' death and resurrection declares all God's promises to you. The cross of Christ would be a sad and tragic story had death fully won. We know that the body of the Son of God was placed in a tomb, and that tomb was filled with the corpse of a dead Jesus. days later, the tomb was

IT!!! EMPTY! So too the cross, it too was empty. And Jesus was made alive and lives and reigns to this day as He is seated at the right hand of God the Father.

I AM THE BREAD OF LIFE

Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to Me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in Me shall never thirst." John 6: 35

Several days ago, I happened to hear one of my favorite songs from the '70's on the radio. "Make It With You" was a hit recorded by the "soft rock" band, Bread. Listening to the music took me right back to my college years. (Supposedly, the name "Bread" was chosen by the group after being stuck in traffic behind a Wonder Bread truck.) The song writer was obviously looking for love; someone who would be by his side through all the ups and downs that life would throw his way.

Life can be short or long,
Love can be right or wrong,
And if I chose the one I'd like to help me through,
I'd like to make it with you.

Interestingly enough, Sunday's Gospel lesson was about Jesus feeding the five thousand. We also discussed this at staff devotions the previous Thursday. The miracle meal included bread. In almost every culture, bread is a staple. Italians have their focaccia; tortillas come from Mexico; pita bread represents the Middle East, along with lavash, a flatbread from Iran and Turkey; matzo is unleavened bread from Jewish culture; Native Americans are known for their wonderful fry bread. Bread is an article of food of the first necessity – a complete life sustainer in which the ingredients combine the sustaining powers of the animal and vegetable kingdom in one product. Grain is exceptionally nutritious and can be consumed on its own.

Bread is also significant in Christianity. Jesus said, "I am the Bread of Life." When we pray, "Give us this day our daily bread," it covers far more than bread itself. Bread includes all the necessities of life – not just a short-term physical need. We put our trust in God to provide for us in every way. Bread is God's Word, a staple of our spiritual life. Real Life comes from feeding on God's Word. Bread also represents the part of God's family that lasts forever – the Church. Bread represents and is Jesus' sacrifice in the Lord's Supper, reminding us of how much He loved us so we would inherit eternal life.

In the above hit by Bread, our Lord would be the perfect One to be by our side for life. He is our Staple, Sus-

tainer and Strength. In my home church, down in the old basement fellowship hall, there was a song board attached to the wall above the serving window. Before every meeting or event where food was served, this verse was always sung:


"Feed Thy children, God most holy; comfort sinners poor and lowly.

O Thou Bread of Life from heaven, bless the food Thou here hast given!

As these gifts the body nourish; may our souls in graces flourish

Till with saints in heav'nly splendor at Thy feast due thanks we render."

The old kitchen is hardly used anymore and the fellowship hall was made into classrooms. The serving window is still there, as is the original song board. It's a good reminder of God's blessings, past and present.

"The church has a *staff apartment*?" I am surprised to occasionally find out that some individuals have no idea that the church owns a two-family apartment house just across the street. Well, we do! It is a nice blessing to have. The next question typically is: "How much does it get used?" That depends of course. *The Staff Apartments* as they are so called, are used as needed, which can be and has been anything from: Hong Kong students coming to visit, guest preachers, musical groups and their team, Captive Free when they were a thing, Pastor Rajek and family when we called him and family until they could purchase their own home, Main Street Living taping group stays there once to twice a year, other Pastors have called and have had members traveling across the state during inclement weather and asked if they could stay there to keep their family safe. Other guests and visitors of the church have used it as needed as well. Perhaps a yearly average of once every month, or once every two months might seem approximate. While we can't permanently house guests and families there outside of church business for long term because of the tax status of the property, we can utilize it for those who come into our midst as a way to love and care for them. We have a member who graciously donates their time to clean, change sheets, and help upkeep the inside of that building. For that we are thankful!

The new two-stall garage added in '15 has been a great addition to that property. Another great addition, as of this past July, has been the donation of two end tables, two lamps, and a wonderful pull-out sleeper sofa that is less than 2 years old. We thank the individual who gifted in-kind these items. And a special thanks to Matt King, Brain Zeeb, Brian's two sons, and one other person who helped to move the items in. If there is something you'd like to donate and it is new, in good condition, or gently used that might possibly be a good addition to the Staff Apartment, please let the Pastors know who in turn will bring it to the Trustees and Facility Administrator. Not everything will fit the need, but it's certainly worth asking! We thank God for


