

In This Time of Vacancy

I am taking a break from my usual stained glass window articles to focus on this time of vacancy. With Pastor Cory taking his new call to Latvia, we are together in a transition. God will continue to provide, including bringing another pastor when it suits him. As we wait for God's time to come, I want to give some encouragement and direction.

Imagine a hospital suddenly losing half of its doctors. That is a bit what our situation is like. We still have the capabilities to assist in your spiritual needs, but our capacity is reduced. This does not mean that anyone is less important. It does mean that some things will take longer to happen, and I will be relying on many of you to assist in numerous ways. Fortunately for me, God has blessed me with plenty of willing and capable people here at Faith.

This time is a great opportunity to reflect upon who we are and where God has given us gifts to use. Pastors provide some level of vision and direction-setting, and I will continue to point us forward. I am also encouraging you to bring ideas about where and how we can use our talents to show God's love both within our church family and without. Some of you have already done this. I greatly appreciate it.

I have a few requests to make of you, and I know that you will take them seriously:

1) Pray for me and my family as I balance the demands of being a husband and father and a

pastor.

2) Pray for us here at Faith that God would bring his life-saving Gospel into our lives and the lives of those around us.

3) Listen for opportunities to help. It might not be a direct request, but God could be nudging you to use your gifts in a new way or for a different purpose.

I am greatly encouraged by the outpouring of love and support that I have seen from this church family. I am firmly convinced that God has wonderful blessings in store for us, and we only have to walk forward in faith, trusting him to provide. With his prior track record, this should be an easy task for us. But it seems like we usually have a hard time trusting God, especially when big changes occur in our lives. He already knows who and when and how another pastor will come to us. Our job is to sit tight and let him do the difficult work. Fortunately, God is very good at difficult and impossible jobs.

The transition of a vacancy might seem like a daunting time, but this is the way that God moves his pastors to different areas at various times. He uses our gifts to serve first one place and then another. This does not mean that he forgets one area or one group of people. Instead, God calls his pastors forward to where he needs them. He will provide for us when the time is right. We trust him and move forward together into the new way that he has prepared for us.

## LOOK UP, CHILD!

"Let us run with endurance the race God has set before us."

The writer of Hebrews compares our Christian journey to that of running a race. When we run a race, particularly a long one, we need perseverance to not quit when it gets hard. Life is like that. There are ups and downs, stumbling blocks and struggles. A race often starts out feeling quite manageable, but inevitably there can come a point when completing the race seems not only daunting, but perhaps impossible – even to a runner who has trained long and hard.

When darkness seems to win
Where are You now
When the world is crumbling
I can hear you say
Look up child!

When struggling in a race – muscles tightening up, lungs feeling like they're on fire – it can sometimes seem like the runner's eyes lower to the ground and rest on the monotony of watching one foot after the other slowly propel them forward. When watching the ground while running, the distance gained is almost imperceptible.

When all I feel is doubt
Where are You now
When I can't figure it out
Look up child!
Look up child!

However, when the runner looks up toward his goal, he becomes reinvigorated to endure and persist. A Christian's call as a runner is to fix his eyes on God. Our earthly struggles – whether it be illness, conflict, stress, depression – can leave us feeling hopeless. It's easy to stare at discouraging circumstances. If we watch the ground or look behind us, we'll grow weary. As I write this, my brother and I made the decision to put our mother in hospice care this morning. It's also called comfort care. Mom's battle with dementia in the last few months has ravaged her. We don't know whether it will be a month or six months, but we know she'll get extra loving care from the staff; she'll be comfortable, and our Lord will be with her. With eyes stayed on Him, He will provide all the strength we need.

## **DAYCARE NEWS**

This summer we had an absolute blast! Our school -age children enjoyed biweekly field trips. These field trips included Zesto, Lariat Lanes, and Bounce Around City among others. All of our daycare children loved our weekly water play days as well.



Thanks to our Assistant Director Kim, we have finally been able to provide and implement curriculum. The curriculum includes age-appropriate ideas and materials for two-week themes. For example, in August our themes were "Summer Fun/ Circus" and "All About Me." Kim prepares packets or folders for each of the teachers to go through for ideas, and provides any materials (toys, books, etc.) that we have on hand that would go with the two-week theme. It has made it so much easier for our teachers to make weekly lesson plans! Our kids are loving the fresh ideas and materials every other week as well.

In other news, we are working on improving employee benefits throughout our program, so our tuition rates are being raised at the beginning of September. This tuition increase will allow us to raise our starting wage by almost a dollar. This means that we will be giving significant raises to our current employees who are not yet at this new starting wage. We believe that increasing our teachers' wages and improving their benefits to truly reflect the value of what they do and the depth of what they are responsible for will positively impact the care that we provide our communities children!


Both of these times, Sunday School and Midweek, are focused on different yet complementary aspects of God and His Word. Students are encouraged to attend each class.
