On the other hand, our ministry and our facilities do change.

Ministries change as we continue to seek ways of touching lives in our community with the Good News of Christ. Faith Lutheran Preschool, Faith Lutheran Daycare Center, V.B.S., our Crèche Festival, monthly visits to Betty's Place, our Pastors at Maryhouse and Kelly's, the list goes on and on. We constantly are seeking ways to sustain effective ministries and to add or change ways of touching lives in this community.

Our campus has seen large changes over the past 48 years, that "Huge" one half block and a beautiful new Sanctuary in 1961 have seen changes

- In 1978 a new Fellowship Hall was added which gave us worship overflow, classrooms, offices, upstairs restrooms, and yes, Faith Lutheran Preschool.
- In 1996 we added a lovely new Sanctuary, that brought a permanent Daycare Facility, a terrific new Preschool room, helpful offices, and expanded restrooms.
- To accommodate parking and the expansion of the new Sanctuary, we have over the course of years, purchased the three properties on the Euclid side of our campus.
- We were also able to sell the second parsonage, which was paid for, and we were renting on 4th Street by Jefferson School to pick up the two floor apartment across 2nd Street. It has been a Vicarage Apartment, our DCE residence, a guest house for visiting Pastors and missionaries, a place for our V.B.S. music teams and it provided, speaking of willing volunteers, a three stall garage in which both of our vans are stored, our

Circuit Bible equipment, our large mower and other equipment for the maintenance of our campus.

Now, God willing, a final piece of our facility structure will fall into place. We will gather in our Fellowship Hall on February 22 to get updated building costs and updated congregational commitment resolves to make a final decision so that we can move to a ground breaking on May 3 for our Christian Family Life Center. So many people are working so diligently and giving so sacrificially. We are most grateful and hope to move ahead on this project that is over 16 years in the making.

We trust this new addition will not be a "chain" but a facility that provides challenging opportunities for good change that will provide even more fellowship, congregational and community ministry.

Finally, you have heard the old joke: "How many Lutherans does it take to change a light bulb"? Response: "Change!"

Well, that's not true at Faith. We have met many changes, many challenges, many opportunities, with prayer, with discernment, and with vision. The outcome? God has continued to bless our congregation with spiritual and numeric growth.

Change, not a chain, but a challenge. May God spur us on to the challenge!

Each month we study a specific shape, number, color and letter, as well as rotate the toys, puzzles, books and games from the storage closets. There are many passages in the Bible, which speak to the work of the Board of Elders as God's servants to His church here at Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church. One in particular can be found in Paul's message to the church at Thessalonica (1 Thes. 5:16-18), "Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

Throughout 2008, the members of Faith's Board of Elders strove to follow God's will for us. We prayed to open worship services. During our monthly Christ Care meetings, we prayed with our Pastors for those in need of healing, for those in need of comfort and for those celebrating great joys in their lives. We prayed at home for our families, for our friends, and for Faith's pastors, staff, and all of the members of Faith Lutheran. Thanks be to God for the blessings He bestows on the flock of believers at Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church!

The Board of Elders also provided support for our Pastors as they lead the work of His church in the communities of Pierre and Ft. Pierre. This past year the Board adopted a minimum Sunday school attendance requirement (50%) for all 7th and 8th

graders as they work toward confirmation. We also helped work through the financial challenges associated with bringing Concordia Benefits plan health insurance and retirement coverage to all eligible Faith Lutheran staff, including Day care and Preschool staff. In consultation with the Pastors, the elders also approved the scheduling of a midweek summer worship service to begin in June of 2009.

The elders also helped bring the word of Christ into the community through service to others. Elders authorized the distribution of more than \$1,600 from the Love Fund to individuals and families in need. Many times our service somehow revolves around food. On March 17, as in years past, the elders helped to prepare and serve the Passover meal. On May 29 we served 208 on-site meals to people at the Banquet at Southeast Methodist in Pierre and packed another 100 meals to go. On August 4, many members of the Board of Elders joined with lots of others to help move tables and chairs from the church to the staff-housing parking lot for the congregational brat feed. In collaboration with the Board of Missions, a couple of times each year we help serve a light meal to welcome new members into our Faith family. We also take donuts, juice, and coffee to share with the residents at Betty's Place. More blessings and more reasons to give thanks!

Sometimes a strong back is all that is required of an elder. This year right before Thanksgiving, Dale Hartmann led a crew of able-bodied elders in harvesting the sanctuary Christmas tree from the backyard of Creighton and Judith Miller. What a great tree! Thank you to Donna for providing many years loving and caring service to the Daycare and we wish her success with her new adventure. Joyce Solem also left the Daycare this year after serving as Director for seven years. Thank you Joyce for the dedication and devotion you provided to the well being of the children over the years.

Nick Wulf is the Director for the Daycare and is doing very well at his new position. In addition to keeping the Daycare staffed and enrollment up, Nick has been involved with planning for the new daycare facility in the Christian Life Center. He has also been working hard to ensure that the Daycare is in full compliance with State regulations.

The Daycare can care for up to 48 children and generally, enrollment is at 48 with families on a waiting list to enroll. Currently, there are openings in the three to five year old range. We wish to thank Jay Fredrich for his hard work in all he does for the Daycare and for the Preschool. In addition to keeping the facilities clean and well maintained, Jay provides carpentry and handyman skills completing projects for the programs.

We would also like to thank the Board of Trustees for their ongoing support of the programs as well. This year's major project was the installation of two new swings in the spring that were purchased in late 2007.

The Programs continue to raise funds through Dakotamart receipts, Campbell Soup labels, and Land O'Lakes milk container caps. In addition, they have received gifts from the LWML Country Fair. The Preschool has also received gifts from private individuals. Thank you to everyone who has contributed to the fund raising activities, which have been used to purchase equipment and supplies for the programs.

Finally the Board wishes to thank Pastor Urbach, Pastor Willms, the Church staff, and Linda Nill (Treasurer) for their continued support and assistance in the operation of the Daycare and Preschool programs.

During 2008 a number of issues were addressed by the Board of Trustees, board membership changed, and new officers were elected. In June, Steve Johnson, Ed Poile, Dave Johnson, Scott Collison, and Jerry Stern left the board. Dale Knapp became board chairman, Roger Larson vice-chairman and Leonard Spomer secretary. Building maintenance has been handled throughout the year in a very efficient and very professional manner by Jay Fredrich. Jay has been very effective in bringing to the board's attention those issues and problems that must be addressed in order to maintain such a facility as ours. With his special skills and talents Jay has also been able to keep the church campus clean and in good working order.

During 2008 the Board of Trustees was able to bring to the campus a new shed for storage, two new linden trees, caulk the parking lot cracks, maintain the lawns and buildings, cover the cost of all utilities and vehicle needs within the budget proposed.

In November, a new budget was proposed with an increase of approximately \$20,000 to \$102,600 for 2009. Approximately half of the line items in the new budget line items remained the same for 2009. The changes made were to the property improvements which went form \$8,000 in 2008 to \$20,000 in 2009. This increase would allow us the chance to address the need for new floor covering in the Sanctuary. The Capital Purchase was increased from \$3,000 to \$8,000 in 2009 in order to allow the church the opportunity to purchase a new floor scrubbing machine which will be needed after the completion of the new structure. Utilities were reduced from \$20,000 to \$18,000 because it was realized that those cost were not as high as the board had anticipated. Funding for vehicles was increased to \$3091.32 because the vehicles are getting older and may need additional repairs.

Finally, as board we like to applaud our facility manager, Jay Fredrich, for the excellent service he has provided for the congregation of Faith Lutheran Church.

ENDOWMENT FUND

Your generous gifts continued to help sustain the mission of the Faith Evangelical Lutheran Endowment Fund in 2008.

Since it's start the fund has dispersed \$64,331.67 in income. In 2008 alone, the fund distributed \$5200.72 -- the largest income distribution in the Fund's history. The by-laws require that 15% of the income earnings be dedicated to missions and 15% be dedicated to assisting students studying for fulltime church work. To see full disbursements check the 2008 Endowment Report in the Stewardship tract rack.

Your gifts to the Fund are prudently invested in a variety of income-producing investments that support the mission of the Fund. Income for Fund disbursements is generated by the Fund's holdings of CDs, Bonds, and a dividend-paying mutual fund. The Endowment Fund board prayerfully considers investments that will provide steady income and conserve the principal so that your gifts continue to make meaningful contributions to our congregation's mission.

Building Committee

The Building Committee for the Christian Family Life Center met for the first time on May 7, 2008. Since that time, the committee has been very active with monthly meetings.

The committee members are: Brent Adney – Vice Chairman, Scott Collison, Larry Coyle, Diane Deis, Steve Ingram, Jim Russell, Loren Schaefer, Neil Schochenmaier – Secretary, Laurie Schultz – Chair, Bob Shoup and Forrest Wixon. The Ex-Officio members are: Pastor Brad Urbach, Pastor Levi Willms, Jay Fredrich, Jan Larson and Nick Wulf.

The Christian Family Life Center will provide for a larger Fellowship Hall, and will relocate the Daycare from its current basement facility. This will allow for easier accessibility, and get the kids up into the light. Future classroom space on the second floor is also being planned.

At our first meeting, a vice chair and secretary were selected. The committee discussed contracting with Architecture Inc. of Sioux Falls to do the building design. Discussion was held regarding building set

backs, variances, utility relocations, Daycare needs, plan revisions, and establishing a Kitchen Committee.

It was originally proposed that the kitchen be shared between the Daycare and the Fellowship Hall. Through input from the Kitchen Committee and the evolving design discussions, it was decided that separate kitchens would be needed. It was also decided to flip the building from the original concept drawings and the Daycare area was changed from the southeast corner to the northwest corner of the addition. This would give the Daycare easier access to the playground. Further changes resulted in the proposed Daycare site going into the current Fellowship Hall.

The Kitchen Committee did a great job of selecting a layout, and materials for the new kitchen. The design will be very similar to the kitchen in the Methodist Church. The design includes an efficient dishwasher.

In September, letters were sent to six contractors asking them for a letter of interest regarding our project. Four of the contractors were interviewed, and Sioux Falls Construction was selected to be our construction manager. Sioux Falls Construction was the contractor who built our last project, which included our current church facility.

Sioux Falls Construction has been working closely with Architecture Inc. to find construction materials and techniques that will save us money. The goal is to have a quality project within economic constraints.

The underground utilities that were in the middle of our lot needed to be relocated in preparation of the upcoming construction. Contracts were made with the City electric department and Qwest telephone service to relocate their lines. The utilities were moved in October and November, and are now in the boulevard along Grand Avenue. The utility easement was vacated with a public hearing being held in December.

Architecture Inc. is developing final plans, with anticipated bid openings in March. A groundbreaking is planned for May.

We live in a land of plenty, which promotes its own twist on contentment. Its version is "buy and possess." Our culture is geared far more to the material than the spiritual. Our society tells us that we need and deserve more, and that life is not complete unless we have the finest homes and cars plus wealth and success. We are led to believe that happiness and contentment are within our reach if we just acquire a few more things. Advertisements are geared to make us feel discontent so that we will buy more things to make us happy.

Greed will not allow contentment, because it always urges us to acquire more. A person can spend a lifetime chasing prosperity that, when found, often destroys him as discussed in the following story:

A ship full of men sailed to an island to look for gold. When they arrived, they divided into two groups. One group would dig for gold; the other would plant crops and prepare the food. As time went on, they found more gold. More of the men who prepared the food began to dig for gold. As more men came to

the island, most of them also dug for gold. Even the ship was torn apart so the wood could be used to support the mineshafts. The story ends when some time later, people visited the island and found skeletons draped over vast treasures. Greed had taken over; and they had completely missed their meaning and purpose in life.

Money has been called "the god of those who have too much, and the goal of those who have too little." Blessed indeed is the person who avoids these extremes. Max Anders said it well; :God wants us to have wealth; we must be careful not to settle for money." Our goal as God's people is to seek first God's kingdom and His righteousness. He has promised to take care of our needs.

In the year of our Lord 2008 our total giving as a congregation was \$791,686.36, which was larger than our largest year of our congregation ever in 2007 of \$781,320.20 which had included the very large offering on First Fruits Sunday when we kicked off our 3-year "Building Together in Faith" Campaign.

Thank you for your steadfast and sacrificial giving that not only builds our Building Fund but also sustains the daily life of our congregation.

"God loves a cheerful giver". Indeed!
