Epiphany House Blessing

When Jesus, son of Mary, son of God, was born in a Bethlehem stable, he was at once Good News to the Jewish people. Proclaimed by angels to shepherds in a field, he was the long-awaited Messiah. Those humble shepherds were not expecting anything out of the ordinary that night, but they were the first to hear that God's promise to the Chosen People had been fulfilled. The story could have ended right there.

But God had another more glorious plan. The Magi were seekers, not fully knowing what they were looking for. A sign in the heavens, a bright star, pointed the way, they believed, to the birth of a new king. Certainly, the births of kings were major events. But in their seeking, the Magi were to find even more than they expected: the Savior, not only of the Jews, but of the Gentiles as well.

Jesus today, early in the freshness of a new year, is just as much the Savior of the world as he was when the travelers from the east reached their destination. We pay homage as they did, remembering that he came to free us from sin and death and give us a share of his very life.

One way to acknowledge our Savior is to make a simple mark on our doorways to bless our homes for the new year. With numerals of the new year and the initials CMB, we mark the entrance to our homes with a piece of chalk. The

letters C, M and B stand for the traditional names of the Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. CMB also stands for the Latin words *Christus Mansionem Benedicat*, or "Christ bless this house." With this simple blessing we open our homes to the salvation Jesus offers and proclaim him once again as the Savior of the world.

Our Fulfillment Committee has provided this simple house prayer. We hope sometime early in January, Tuesday, January 6, The Day of Epiphany would be a great day, you will chalk the following by your house number—

A blessed New Year! How is your Spanish? Even if not very good, the above expression is one we know, "My house, your house." Simply said when you have house guests you want them to feel at home in the same manner they would feel in their own homes. That means what's in the frig is theirs as well and they don't need to ask to use the washer and dryer.

It truly appears in our joyful worship response to the God we adore in two ways.

- 1. Our beautiful Sanctuary which we built is really God's. "God, our house of worship is Your house of worship. Please dwell here in all Your glory."
- 2. Since it is really God's house, he provides us a place, a home, in which He invites us to celebrate Word, Sacrament and Praise.

Hence, "*Mi casa, Su casa*" works both ways as we view the Sanctuary God has provided for us at 714 N. Grand Ave, the third formal Sanctuary in our 77 year history.

In 2009, in a partnership between Oahe Habitat for Humanity, Thrivent Financial Service for Lutherans, Faith Lutheran, Resurrection Lutheran and Lutheran Memorial a new Habitat for Humanity house is being built for a worthy family. Thrivent is providing 70% of the funds through a grant, the local Chapter 20% and our three local congregations 10%. We have set aside our share as approved in our Voter's Assembly. More importantly than money will be all the hands needed to build this new home. Our three parishes will be very important to this. We are grateful to Lee Axdahl who will lead our effort. Lee has given an enormous amount of time to previous Habitat builds.

Our homes! How often is this prayer said? "Come Lord Jesus be our Guest,..." That's quite an invitation. We invite Christ to our homes. We say, "my home is Your home". It runs even deeper than that for we are also praying for Christ to hasten His Second

Coming. Sometimes when I view this world, I think it would be a good time for Christ to return.

So in 2009 we are asking all of our families on the Day of Epiphany, January 6, or around that day, to dedicate their homes to be a dwelling place for God.

- Enclosed is a "house prayer" to use. After you have used this prayer, why not put it on your frig using your "Building Together in Faith" magnet as a constant reminder that your home is God's home.
- Need a piece of chalk, well you will find one in the Narthex beginning December 28. It will be great sidewalk chalk once you have written this above your house number dedicating your home as God's home!

As this letter is written, over 1.3 million dollars has been placed in our Building Fund from Congregation gifts, Estate gifts from Vic and Dorothy Young and good investment interest.

Because we have contracted with Architecture Inc. for precise plans and have engaged Sioux Falls Construction on the front side as our contractor, we are now beginning to deal with real numbers.

These numbers exceed the 2.5 million we were hopeful for. So, in January as we seek to firm up the numbers, review our congregational commitment and the limits of our ability to borrow, we will have some large decisions as a congregation to make. It's all doable but it will take congregational resolve. It too will take what we have said from the beginning—

"Every family doing all it can" as we make and then strive to meet and exceed our commitments.

From the beginning we have also said—

"Different gifts, Equal Sacrifice"

That has not changed.

Finally for all the families who have, over the years, given an Angel Ornament for the Christmas tree—Thanks!






In January we will begin to meet on the first Monday of the month at 7:00 for Darthall
