Great District News!

Pastor David Schwan, our District's Executive Secretary has shared some wonderful year-end Budget news.

For the first time in five years our District ended its Fiscal year in the black.

Total income \$1,254,238.00

Total Expenses \$1,250,068.00

78% of our District's 115 congregations met or exceeded their commitments.

71% of the congregations met or exceeded their T.I.M. (Together In Missions) commitment that supports the ministry of Amy & Marat Kashenov in Kazkhstan.

Faith exceeded their District commitment remitting to our District \$33,524.00 and to our District's T.I.M. project \$1,300.00.

Our commitment to our District/Synod for 2010 is \$33,420.00 and to our District's TIM project \$1,300.

Thank you for your faithful, generous giving that not only supports our beloved congregation but the broader work of our District and Synod as well.



Displaced!

Greetings to you in the Risen

Lord Jesus! It is Christianity's great battle cry:

"Christ is Risen."

"He is Risen, indeed! Alleluia!"

With that wondrous cry death is displaced with life and darkness is displaced with the fullness of Christ's light.

In mid-March one of our groups meeting at church needed to meet in a new place rather than their familiar spot. One of the great servant-hearted gals in this group said, "I feel displaced." Our whole staff sympathizes as we still find ourselves going in the wrong direction to new rooms or rooms that don't exist anymore. Yes indeed, "displaced."

The expression served my devotional time with them well. You see, we are all displaced. A hymn I truly like, but we don't sing a lot, states it well:

I'm but a stranger here, Heav'n is my home;

Earth is a desert drear, Heav'n is my home.

Danger and sorrow stand Round me on ev'ry hand;

Heav'n is my fatherland, Heav'n is my home.

LSB 748 Verse 1

We are displaced, earth is not our long-term home, heaven is. Here we are aliens, strangers, visitors. Heaven, Eden restored, paradise, that is our eternal dwelling place. St. Paul states it well:

"Therefore we are always confident and know that as long as we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord. We live by faith, not by sight. We are confident, I say, and would prefer to be away from the body and at home with the Lord. So we make it our goal to please him, Whether we are at home in the body or away from it." 2 Corinthians 5:6-9

So we, God's wondrously created children, are displaced. Yet we sing and serve, love and obey, share and give.

What's New—

Our Second Floor Goals—Our goal is to finish the St. Matthew Room, rough out the St. Mark Room, and finish the complete hallway.

Why?

- We can use the larger St. Matthew Room and even in time St. Mark. We lose both the old Fellowship Hall and Library and need a couple of larger rooms.
- It will certainly look much nicer when you look upstairs from the gym.
- It will help us secure those upper areas since all the doors and frames are on site.
- It will keep us from trying to heat and cool those large areas with the heating and cooling units of the Gym.

A couple of large carpet decisions—

The Building Committee has chosen carpet squares for the living room, Daycare, and the '96 Narthex. The squares are in stock and will have it done by Easter.

There has been a large expression to get the Narthex carpet replaced due to its wear and the raised areas. This is an expense we had not planned for but in order to match carpets, now is the time to do it. *Please remember the extra expense for the Narthex, which is \$10,000.00, in your Building Fund giving. Thanks!*

• Lobby Wall Decision—We had really hoped to save the 1978 addition wall in the lobby out of history consideration. There were just simply too many cracks, holes, and discoloration. Therefore it has been sheet rocked. The door frames in that wall were also replaced as they had badly rusted out. New doors will be in the new frames in the lobby.

Progress—as you receive this April Newsletter

- The "Living Room", which is the passage between our Sanctuary/Narthex and our Christian Family Life Center (CFLC), will be done!
- The Lobby of the CFLC is done!
- The 1996 Narthex is re-carpeted. The '96 carpet was worn and we had extension glue failure. This carpet will

now match the "Living Room" carpet.

The Commercial Dishwasher has been installed. The cost of the commercial dishwasher for the kitchen includes much more than just the large capacity fast washing dishwasher. (The wash cycles for the washer can be set for 1, 2, 4 or 6 minutes.) There are two large stainless steel tables that run along each side of the washer. The soiled table is where the dishes are returned through a pass through window. This table runs about 7 feet long and has a large one horse power disposal at the end of it. The dish racks pass over this and are rinsed with a pre rinse that has a wall mounted spray arm. The racks are then slid into the washer. After they are cleaned, they slide out onto a 6 foot clean table where they will be unloaded. Next to that is a deep stainless steel triple sink. A large hood vent will help keep the steam and heat out of the kitchen when the washer is running.

The cost of the commercial dishwasher unit is \$22,000. It is being funded by —

Special designated gifts from Pete & Ruth Hansen, Dave & Janice Johnson, Pauline Votteler, and Sandy Hobart.

The proceeds from the Auction of \$8333.75

The proceeds from the rummage sale, \$838.71

A \$6000 gift from our LWML,

and a part of our "Really Noisy" offering which totaled \$4622.74, of which \$2,109.74 was change. The balance of the "Really Noisy" offering will go to help us close the margin in the funding of the Christian Family Life Center.

Interim Financing—We are borrowing up to \$100,000 from Bank West to handle our last two payments to Sioux Falls Construction.

We trust this will be re-paid quickly as:

- Commitments continue to be fulfilled,
- Givers consider exceeding their commitments.
- Those who are giving without commitments continue to give generously,
- Those who have not given feel a heartfelt desire to help with this challenging project as we near the end of our building.

You Can't Have One, Without the Other!

Hello Christian Friends,

You can't have one, without the other! There are just some things in life that way. You can't have thunder, without lightning, or lightning that doesn't produce thunder. You can't have taxes if there is no government and you can't have a government without taxes, as much as we wish we did. It is probably easy, or maybe not, to come up with many examples. One is life and death. Sure for a moment, in the garden, there was a possibility of life without death, but in a sinful world, we know nothing of that, there is just life and death. You can't have life with out death and death without life.

Since not everyone is so fortunate to hear my Palm Sunday Sermon, okay you can stop laughing. This Newsletter will give you one of the points that always comes up. You can't have Easter without Good Friday. Sure you can go, you can sing, you can tell God you love him, but you didn't really have it. You can't have life without death, you can't know the life God gives, without struggling with the death, the punishment nailed to the cross, the payment for sin. It is equally true that you can't have Good Friday without Easter, then the payment was pointless, as Paul says if Christ is not Risen, we are stuck in our sins, death has not been conquered. Pastor Urbach had a recent sermon where he said a goal he would love to attain is 1000 people for Easter morning. What an awesome goal, I can't wait for that day, I have shared a goal with you as well, that one day we would have attendance on Good Friday equal to that of Easter Sunday, that all would get the full meal deal, because we can't really have one without the other. Don't get me wrong, you can miss a service on Good Friday or Easter for that matter and still grasp and worship God for both His death and Resurrection. But wouldn't it be great if we as a church body attested with our attendance the wondrous truth of the importance of observing Christ's death and His Resurrection. I think we will reach Pastor Urbach's goal, before mine, and that is okay, because I have part of my Palm Sunday sermon written for the next 1000 years.

But there is one other thing about all this that I think is important and why our observance of Good Friday and Easter are so sacred in reminding us of what is also true throughout

the year. Paul writes in Romans chapter 6, "Don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? When we were baptized into his death, we were placed into the tomb with him. As Christ was brought back from death to life, by the glorious power of the Father, so we, too should live a new kind of life. If we've become united with him in a death like his, certainly we will also be united with him when we come back to life as he did." Every day our old self has been killed with Christ in his sacrifice and God has given us life. We receive life from the death of our sin in the crucifixion of Christ and His Resurrection, passed on to us in the gift of Baptism. You are alive and don't have to fear death, because only in Jesus do we experience that life is really not life on the way to death, but death on the way to everlasting life. We are dying to live. May you join me and our church this Holy Week, but also daily all year long, dying to sin, dying to the Old Adam, witnessing Christ's gift of life in death, and living the joy of the Resurrection to newness of
