Signs are important. We hear the words of Isaiah: "Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel."

Isaiah 7:14

or John's statement in the Gospel of John after Jesus changed water to wine:

"This, the first of His miraculous signs Jesus performed in Cana of Galilee." St. John 2:11

or Matthew's words about Jesus speaking of the last Days:

"At that time the sign of the Son of Man will appear in the sky, and all the nations of the earth will Pastor Brad Urbach mourn. They will see the Son of Man coming on the clouds of the sky, with power and great glory."

He has blessed us in many and various ways, but especially with the forgiveness of sins we have in our Lord Jesus, together with the hope of the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting. We also give him thanks that he has allowed us to live in this place to share that good news with the people in Rosebud.



There have been a couple of nice things happen recently. One is in Parmelee. We had our usual Tuesday after school Bible School classes. We were invited to the Boys and Girls Club

for some event they were having where the newspaper came and things like that. So we quit pretty early, and went over there. When we were there one of the girls about age 12 came and said to me, when are we going back to the church? I said pretty soon. So we went back to church, and a few other kids came along. As we were walking over there, she said, "Now when we get to church we have to do the whole thing, read the lesson, do the craft, watch the video and eat!". It was fun for me because it showed that she really liked doing the things we do, and she read the Bible story from the Bible herself. For that I am thankful.

I also received a call from a man the other day who is a Lutheran from Sioux Falls. He and his wife have been living in Rosebud for about a year and a half. I am pretty sure they are going to join the church. His wife is Catholic, but doesn't attend. They are a young couple and that is nice.

Also as you know John Arcoren continues to live with me, and he is a very spiritual and uplifting young man. He has started a Bible study that he

leads on Saturday afternoons at the church. He has some of his family attending as well as some of his friends. I also have him helping with the children's sermons at church. It has only been a few times so far, but it has been good both for him, as well as for the members of the church.

We also are having an alcohol recovery Bible study to help those who are just out of treatment. We are doing this together with some of the people from the treatment center, and it seems like it will be a good thing. We are doing this on a rotating basis in different locations one of which is our church in Parmelee. I usually have a worship service there on a Sunday once or twice a session.

We are looking forward to our Christmas season. We will be having our Christmas parties and Christmas caroling both in Rosebud and Parmelee. These are always fun community events.

We pray that your upcoming Holiday season is blessed by our Lord Jesus, and that during that season you have the opportunity to share Christ.

Thank you for your generous gifts so far in November of

- Your gifts in these past weeks enable us to make our December 1st payment of \$5,836.00 to the South Dakota Church Extension Fund.
- Your gifts also helped us, as of our November 14 Board of Stewardship meeting to apply another \$10,000 to our Bank West short-term loan. Our debt started at \$56,000, it is now reduced in principal to \$14,515.25 and in interest to \$738.36 for a total of \$15,253.61. We are about there! Thank you.
- We will also able to make 3 advanced payments. Two of our families gave gifts for 2 advanced principal payments and we received an Estate gift of \$1,000.00 from the Estate of Doris Weischedel. We will add to this \$136.05 from the Building/Debt Fund and made advanced principal payment # 18. Thus far, we have made 12 advance principal payments saving \$56,864.21 in interest.

- We thank Helen Kiepke for a microwave for the office workroom.
- A new Coke vending machine has been placed in the Lobby by the drinking fountains. It has some "healthy" drinks in it and it will be closer to much of our activities. The pop machine on the landing of the Great Room will remain.
- Two extra old light fixtures will be placed in the Luke/ John Room. This room has become a game room for our youth. In addition to the two Foosball tables, the Ping-Pong table has been moved to that room as well.
- The floors in the Luke/John Room have been sealed and ½ of the floor in the St. Paul room has also been sealed. This was a result of a gift from the Gert Mueller Estate.
- The light fixture directly outside the St. Matthew room has been tied to the staircase lights. This gives us better light on that staircase when the St. Matthew room is used and we don't need to turn on all the upstairs hallway lights.
