A Letter From Our Pastors

Synergism

Greetings in the Lord Jesus Christ! It is 8:00 Wednesday evening, October 13, in the year of the November brings wonderful moments in which we Lord 2010. The 33rd miner has just come to the surface. It is a remarkable moment. It is a swallow hard, say Amen, and clap your hands moment! Yet, this evening we trust the six rescuers will return to the surface as well.

The theological parallels are large. Thirty-three helpless miners with no way to save themselves. They were deep in the belly of the warm earth, hopelessly sealed off from the surface of that Chilean silver mine.

The rescue must come from above. We couldn't help but think of Martin Luther's Christmas hymn

"From heaven above to earth I come to bear good news to every home..." LSB 358

or a more contemporary song—

"You came from heaven to earth to show the way..." Lord I Lift Your Name on High

This miraculous event has a rich parallel to Christ. We helpless humans without an eternal hope have a Savior who came from above to the depths of the human dilemma and rescues, and will on the Day of Resurrection, bring us bodily to our eternal home.

Many of the miners wore shirts that said "Gracias Senor," yes indeed, "thanks, Lord."

That brings us back to that first word, "synergism" The word means, "the theological doctrine that regeneration is effected by a combination of human will and divine grace." Websters II

As it is used in theological terms, it conveys the thought that mankind can save themselves or at least assist in their salvation. As Lutheran Christians we hold that the scriptures clearly teach, contrary to synergism, that we are saved by God's grace alone, "Sola Gratia." That is the heart of what we believe, teach, and confess.

ESTATE GIFT

We received a gift of \$11,000 from the Estate of Gert Mueller. What a wonderful gift! The \$11,000 will be used in the following manner:

\$7,000 for a Video upgrade of our video equipment used for recording the services. This equipment will increase the quality of our recordings that are used for our Cable Broadcast on Wednesdays and the source of our service on the Web-site.

It will also give us the possibility of live streaming and perhaps a live cable capacity at some point.

\$1,000 to balance out our audio in our Sanctuary sound system.

\$2,000 for the Building Fund of which half will be used to seal the floor in the Luke/John room, which will provide for a cleaner Christian Family Life Center. Sealing that concrete floor will eliminate that fine dust that comes from an unsealed floor.

The other half will be used for an advanced Building Payment toward our Church Extension Fund loan. This will be for the principal payment # 13, which is actually \$1,109.22, which will save us \$4,726.78 on interest for that payment.

Hence, the gift adds nearly \$5,000.00 of value to the gift Gert left us.

\$1,000 to establish the Elevator Fund. We cannot finish the balance of the second floor until we install an elevator, which at this point in time is about \$50,000.00.

In our 2011 Budget, the Board of Trustees, and the Board of Stewardship will make provision for an elevator fund.

Building News

Debt Retirement

Thank you—we are so grateful so many families, even new families are helping with our 6 month extension of our Building Fund.

It has served three purposes—

- finish up odds & ends.
- reduce the short term loan to Bank West significantly.
- meet our Church Extension Fund monthly obligation.

So how are we doing?

From all of us to all of you and from all of you to all of us—an enormous THANK YOU!

- The Bank West Short-term loan as of 10/10/10, the principal and interest is now at \$25,116.43. We have already cut this \$56,000 short-term debt in more than half.
- Our South Dakota Church Extension Fund loan. On November 1 we make our fifth regular monthly payment. Also as of November 1 we have made nine advanced payments saving \$42,748.13 in interest. These advanced payments have been made through gifts designated for Debt Retirement.

It bears repeating—if we would make no advanced payments during the course of the 30-year loan we would pay \$1,097,145.95 in interest. But, our District makes it possible for us to make advanced principal payments saving that month's interest.

In big round numbers our Debt Payment each month is \$6,000 (actually \$5,836.00) and right now a principal payment is \$1,000. So, for a \$1,000 gift to Building Debt Retirement we save close to \$5,000 in interest.

So, if you give \$1.00 you are really giving \$6.00 at this point in the loan. If you give \$100.00 it has a

value of \$600.00. If you give \$1,000.00 it has a value of \$6,000.00

After our 6 month extension and we eliminate our Bank West loan, we hope, with a well thought out plan, to drastically reduce the interest on our Church Extension Fund loan

"The Lord loves a cheerful giver." We are grateful God has placed in our congregation scores of cheerful givers! Thank you!






Forever Young is a group of retired and semi-retired folks who enjoy good food and great fellowship. Are you 55 or over? Please join us.

Hong Kong Mission Trip

Pastor David Schwan, who has accepted a call to be senior pastor of Zion Lutheran in Rapid City, is assembling a team for a mission trip to Hong Kong. The team will be based in a Lutheran junior/senior high school where it will help teach some of the classes during the day, and make use of all available time for interacting and sharing with the students. Dates for the trip are February 17-27, 2011, and the approximate cost will be \$1,800 per person (\$1,200 airfare and \$600 in-country fee which covers lodging at the school and most other expenses including meals and transportation). No special training is needed—just a desire to share Jesus' love. Don't worry about what you would say—the kids are very open and ask lots of questions. It should be emphasized that even though this is a Christian School, most of the students and even the majority of the teachers are *not* Christians. Many of the people in Hong Kong, young or old, do not have much of a hope for the future, or much of a sense of self-worth in a society that does not place importance on the individual. So, this trip is a real opportunity to let these kids (and teachers) know how valuable they are to God—so much so that He Sent His Son for them—and to let them know that through Jesus they can have *real* hope.
