We need:

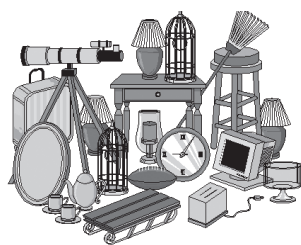
- Lots of hands to paint the upstairs block walls with the paint called "Block Filler". Please bring a roller and a 1 1/4 roller brush for this project.

way to help us close the financial gap as we near the end of the Building Phase of our "Building Together in Faith" campaign.

The idea was to:

- Have everyone in your family save your change in a pickle jar.
- Then, when the pickle jar is filled, pour your change into an empty coffee can, and continue collecting coins.
- Then, when the coffee can is filled pour it into a shoe box, and
- Then, at whatever stage you are at - pickle jar, coffee can or shoe box - bring it to church in the season of Epiphany (which begins Wednesday, January 6 until Ash Wednesday) so we could have a very noisy offering as we complete the final remodeling for our transition into the new Building.

Why a pickle jar, a coffee can, or a shoe box?

Well, a **shoe box** because lots of shoes will use the new facility. In addition to serving as a Fellowship Hall, we also expects lots of tennis shoes (belonging to people of all ages) to make their way through the addition for exercise and activities such as walking, volleyball, basketball, and LYF and JYM dodge ball.

A **coffee can** because lots of coffee will be prepared and consumed in that new Fellowship Hall.

And a **pickle jar** because Pickle Ball is a growing game in our community and throughout this country. Pastor Urbach is eager to share the new games with a lot of people in the parish and the community.

Why not have a special Epiphany Celebration for the first day of our "very noisy offering" and sing the Wise Men hymns, and have a big Epiphany star and read out the Matthew 2 account why, perhaps we could even have Wise Men.

Good idea! Let's plan on a wonderful January 6 service at 7:30 p.m.

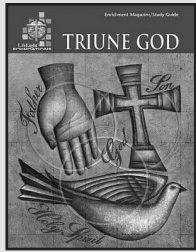
The January session is "High Tech Meets Low Tech". It discusses computer and cell phone use as well as cyber bullying and texting.

Please note that Milton Creagh will be in Pierre on Monday, March 29th and Tuesday, March 30th. A more detailed schedule will be in the February mailing.

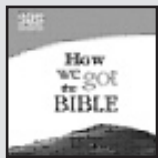
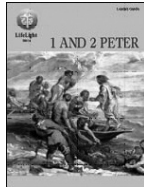

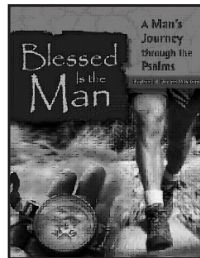

entitled "Fearless." Fear seems to be in the driver's seat these days.

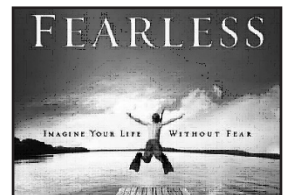
People are troubled and anxious.
