


Almighty God, have mercy upon us, forgive us our sins, and lead us to everlasting life. Amen.

Building News

Thank you for your gifts of \$1,425.00 to our Building Fund. The gifts were designated to our three accounts:

The Building Account; \$70.00 The Elevator Account; \$535.00 The Debt Retirement Account; \$820.00

Debt Retirement With our regular July 1 Church Extension Fund payment of \$5, 487.00, which comes from the General Fund, we will be able because of your gifts to the Debt Retirement, to make three advance Principal payments. We will now have made 34 advanced payments saving \$157,134.85 in interest.

HVAC At our Trustees June meeting they have approved the installation of the rectangular ductwork for the Sts. Luke, John, and Paul rooms. The proposal from Leidholt, McNeely, and Leidholt is for \$5,860.00. This will provide needed ventilation in these 3 rooms that are used on a regular basis and will make it possible to now bring in heating and cooling from the rooftop units. Your continued gifts have made this possible. Thank you!

Elevator In order to proceed further upstairs the installation of an elevator is essential. Our elevator committee is awaiting responses from Architecture Inc. and Sioux Falls Construction before making a decision on the two proposals they are reviewing.

Darren is a native of Gettysburg, SD. He and his wife, Susan, have three children. Please be prayerful for Pastor Olson as he considers this call.





3 women, 3 generations, 3 topics, 7 weeks (8 weeks with introductory week)—too good to miss!

Join us for a wonderful sampling of three endearing Bible teachers—the seasoned teacher, Kay Arthur; the beloved teacher, Beth Moore; and the sweet, endearing teacher, Priscilla Shirer.



During the first two weeks we will study the book of Hebrews with Kay teaching us a few principles of inductive Bible study, then dive into a two week study of God's abundance and His faithful promises to believers, and conclude with our beloved Beth Moore teaching for two weeks on the surety and truth of God's Word.
