A Message From Pastor Urbach

Greetings in the Lord Jesus our Advent King! Advent King? Yes Advent King, we are already on the doorstep of Advent with Christmas to follow!

Advent also brings a time in which we still have just one pastor. Our first three calls have been declined. This caused one of our members to say, "Is something wrong with our parish?"

Well, the answer is not at all. We are short staffed and certainly need help soon. But if anything, it is the reason that things are well.

Three thoughts stand out for me as to our calls thus far. Before I list my three thoughts I wish to share with you my thanks to the Board of Elders for the time they have spent working over the call list and for the time they have spent visiting with possible Associate pastors. They have also been excellent in finishing our early service. I try to be here once a month to finish the service. I enjoy doing that and being here between services but also wish not to neglect Trinity in Blunt.

So, three thoughts:

- First of all, all three men that we called were excellent pastors and were fairly content in their present parish. Two of them had had new opportunities happen in their parish that prompted them to feel they needed to stay in their present ministry.
- Secondly, we have a strong

youth component in the ministry description that is pretty hands on. The three called pastors while having youth experience did not feel a real hands on ministry now fit in with their approach to youth ministry.

 Thirdly, someone in a good situation is not always willing to follow a pastor of about 38 years in one place. I understand these things. When I came to Faith in 1974 I did not envision being here 38 years but I did have two goals. I was determined to stay at least 10 years or until the parish had grown 1000 souls. Well obviously these goals came and went.

In my 30's and 40's I had tons of calls, a few times even multiple calls at the same time. At first I kept track of how many calls I had, then after a while just lost track..

Some calls were very appealing and if I could have taken all of you I might have moved. Some calls I knew immediately it just didn't fit me and my abilities.

Every time a parish calls a pastor from another church it can set up a long chain of churches without pastors.

Every pastor pondering a call does desire to be sure it is a good fit for him and his family.

So it's complicated. Before Pastor Heideman came here I believe I heard some 17 pastors were called. It is a time consuming process. At this point we are now looking at returning to the Seminary for a young man and speaking to Concordia University in St. Paul, MN and Seward, NE about DCE graduates. While new graduates don't always have lots of experience, they have good enthusiasm.

So while we press on I still miss Pastor Willms and enjoyed our working relationship. He seems to be doing well and with three children it's a busy household. They have been in a small apartment and are moving shortly to a rental home which they hope to buy after their home in Pierre sells.

So be patient in the Lord as we await some staff help and while we wait I thank all of you for the extra help and prayers as sometimes with big sighs we move on to the next project.

I await the season of Advent and its terrific preparation to get our hearts and homes ready to celebrate our Savior's birth.

- To accomplish this we will have Brock Construction tape & texture not only the St. Paul room but while we are doing this to tape & texture the Luke/John room as well.
- Get ready for a Saturday paint Party complete with doughnuts and coffee.
- In both the Luke/John room the North walls will have a combination of closet, cabinets, a working surface and sinks.
- At this point, Luke/John will remain one very large room. In time a wall could divide the room into two rooms as other opportunities arise.

Debt Retirement: Along with our regular monthly payment of \$5,487.00 we are able on December 1 to pay two more advance payments. We have now made 49 advanced payments. The two additional advance payments saved another \$8,462.16 in interest. Thus far advance payments have saved \$221,340.57 which is about 20% of the total \$1,000,000 we would pay on our loan if we did no advance payments. Let's look at our next two payments. The total payment is \$5,487.00. Now if we pay the \$1,264.56 principal payment in advance, we save the \$4,222.44 in interest. The next payment—if we pay the \$1,270.36 principal payment we save the \$4,216.64 in interest.

Once again—every dollar you give to Debt Retirement multiplies its value.



The poetry of this Advent carol was penned by British author Eleanor Farjeon in 1928 and set to the French folk tune, Besancon. Interestingly, Miss Farjeon also wrote "Morning Has Broken." For many centuries, churches traditionally were laid out on an east-west axis. In ancient times, the Church faced east to pray, which was the direction of the rising sun. That act would symbolize the soul looking towards where the true light rises. Daybreak reminds us to welcome and recognize God's presence in our lives each new day.

Furrows, be glad, Though earth is bare, one more seed is planted there. Give up your strength the seed to nourish, That in course the flow'r may flourish. People, look east, and sing today: Love, the Rose, is on the way.



The song directs Christians to turn toward Bethlehem in expectation of the incarnation of God. In other words, we are to "orient" ourselves. The word "orient" means east. During the coming weeks, we will observe Advent, a time of re-orientation, where we will "get our house" in order and re-arrange our spiritual furniture. Just as we would prepare for guests in our homes, we are to ready our hearts and ponder the significance of His coming near. In other words, welcome the Guest!
