

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR BAUMANN

John 8:12 "When Jesus spoke again to the people, He said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

Greetings in Christ Jesus! The end of September will mark one year from a day in which my life was almost forever changed in the blink of an eye... literally. It was a crisp September morning and there I was walking through the dark woods on my grandfather's property in Southeastern Wisconsin just before sun up. I remember taking 10 or so steps away from my vehicle and realizing that I had forgotten to bring a flashlight. I had none with me, and none in my car. Daylight was coming soon, and there was no time to head back to my parent's house to grab one, I wanted to be in the tree stand at first light to hopefully be in position to see deer with my bow and arrow at first light. Walking in the dark would be no problem what-soever, so I thought.

Looking back, that decision almost cost me dearly, it almost cost me the vision in my left eye for which I am now forever thankful for. As I drew near to my stand location, there was one final trail I needed to connect with. I searched in the dark, walking from tree to tree trying to recall where the opening for the trail was. Thorns and prickly ash bushes blocked any attempts to journey through to the other side, and then I saw it through the dark of night... an opening! With eyes fixed on that opening, I stooped

under one of the branches to make my way to it, and that's when it all happened so fast. I felt a sharp and searing pain in the corner of my eye. I whipped my head back away from the branch and immediately put my hands up to my eye. I was not sure what had happened or if I still could see. All I knew was that I was in big trouble. I ever so delicately reached into the corner of my eye closest to my nose to try and figure out what had just happened and that's when I unwedged a small twig that became lodged in the corner of my eye and nose, near my tear duct. By the grace of God that small stick caught me at just the right place, and I was able to leave those woods with the same vision I came with.

When we think we have it all together, that's when it can sometimes hit us. The Apostle Paul encourages us followers of Christ to see with the eyes of faith. He writes in 2 Corinthians 5:7 "We live by faith and not by sight." Perfect vision and clarity come from Jesus Christ alone. He Himself states in John 8:12 "...I am the light of the world." It is easy to make excuses for doing the right thing, to grope around in the dark thinking we have it all figured out, when really what we need is the light. And if we need the light and love of Jesus, how much more a world that is lost in darkness, pain, and hopelessness? As Christ is the light of your world, I earnestly desire and pray that you take that light with you wherever you go, into a world that needs the light. Whatever situation you find yourself in use the light of Jesus in your life, reflect the light of Jesus wherever you go, and walk in the light of Jesus as you live a life different from the world around you. Praise God for the light and love of Jesus Christ. His Word is truth and His Word is light. I leave you with one final passage from Psalm 119:105, "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path." Praise God for His light in this darkness!



They will not be black out shades but shades that would filter the sun. This would also help when we use DVD's in the Christian Family Life Center.

It is amazing what you have done together to finish the upstairs of the CFLC. Thank you!

We also thank you for continued gifts to our Debt Retirement Account.

Debt Retirement - Along with our regular October 1 payment of \$5,395.00 we were able to send an additional principal payment of \$2,433.50 which saved us \$2,961.48 in interest. This is our 78th advance payment and we have now saves\$334,482.72 in interest. We thank you for your continued gifts to Debt Retirement. We hope every month to do at least one advanced payment. When we have sufficient gifts, we will continue to send as many payments as possible so that we may save as much interest as possible.

Sunday School Attendance Policy

The Board of Education has a Sunday School attendance policy to include the fall months and spring months of the school year, which covers our Sunday School months of September through May.

- 1. Attendance will be taken every Sunday.
- 2. Each child can miss only 10 times in the weeks that there is regular Sunday School to be considered for faithful attendance.
- 3. If a child visits a church elsewhere, they will receive credit for that visit with a verbal confirmation, or note from that place of worship, or a note from the parents stating such.
- 4. All awards will be given in September during the church service on Rally Day.
- 5. Milestone years will be year 1, year 5, and year 10.
- 6. Attendance will be retroactive from prior churches. Parents need to give that information to the Sunday School secretary, or the Education coordinator when they register their child in our program.

Teachers mark attendance for each student weekly for accurate attendance count.

Hopefully this system will encourage the children to seek God's Word through the opportunities of Sunday School with the reward given to them for their yearly accomplishments.



FAREWELL...

It is with both sadness and, yet, inner peace that I write this last newsletter, the last issue of SteppeSongs. This will be our "farewell" song. After 2 decades of overseas service with the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, to the former Soviet Republics, God has called me to come home and hang up my hat for a while. I have this month, August 2012, ended my



service with the LCMS, and, with my family, have begun to explore what the future is that God has planned for us stateside. It is difficult to say good bye, not only to service in Kazakhstan, but also to service with the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. But it is the right thing, the right answer to God's will at this time.

The Journey: I remember the anticipation and anxiety as I joined the missionary force on June 1, 1992, just fresh out of college, and heading to St. Petersburg, Russia. Teaching English... Sharing Bible Stories at after-school events... making friends with the teachers, and having Gospel conversations over tea... I (emphasis on I) planned to be there 7 to 10 years... But God already was making His (different) plans known. In 1993, while assisting at New Missionary orientation for newcomers heading to Russia, I prayed Abraham's prayer: Send me, where You will, God. And He did, the very next day! I was reassigned to a team headed to Kazakhstan! And thus began my long journey in taking the people of Kazakhstan into my heart, and their eternal welfare as my life-goal. Almost 20 years of laughter, tears, frustrations, challenges and great rejoicing! While I knew that someday I would be saying goodbye to this second "home land", to the church that arose, to the dear friends and family, I did not know that God would be having me say good bye at this time, and in such a complete way.

But He has new plans for me, for our family. After long years of service, in strenuous, difficult, challenging environments... yet in an amazingly hospitable and loving land... with much moving of stones, plowing of soil and planting of seeds...and, praise God, blooming of the Gospel in the hearts of many in Kazakhstan, God has a new calling for me: to hear His voice saying, "Be still, and know that I am God." And I am going to heed His call, and practice being still for a while. (Until His next call, that is! Because I know He is not done with me yet!)

"Sing to the Lord a new song, sing to the Lord, all the earth.

Sing to the Lord, praise His name; proclaim his salvation day after day." Psalm 96:1-2

My missionary story goes way back further than 1992, even further back than 1991, while I was in Russia during the collapse of the Soviet Union, when God made His calling of me to the former Soviet Republics clear. No, it goes back to 1976 or so, me being in the second grade, and having the wondrous opportunity to hear an LCMS missionary to Africa share of his ministry there. Yes, at 7 years old, in a small town, out in the midst of the fields of South Dakota, I knew that God would have me serve Him as missionary. Back then, and in recent times, I could not, and can hardly now, imagine not spending my entire life overseas, in different cultures, sharing the most important message, the life-saving Gospel. This is why my challenge now will be to just be. To be still.

I am so thankful to God for the awesome privilege it has been to serve Him with the LCMS, and to be involved with His miraculous work changing hearts through the Gospel. The journey has been full of adventure, and I'm so grateful that God allowed me to come along for the ride!

I can't imagine how hard it is going to be to say good bye to these dear friends, to this place that has been our home, but I trust that God will go ahead of me and prepare me when the time comes... Please also continue to pray for the ministry in Kazakhstan, for the church there, for the men, women and children who have come to know Jesus, and for those who have not... I will join you in prayer, as I "be still", and yet continue to be a part of the Kazakhstan journey as a prayer warrior.

Farewell:

And so, this is it. This is farewell. After so many newsletters written over so many years, saying goodbye and ending this "song" is difficult. But Praise God, He gives us new songs to sing on this earth! I wish for each of you and your families the richest of all God's blessings, and pray that He is giving your heart new songs to sing each day! God bless!!! I'm off, now, to remember fondly and rejoice once again (and again) over all the Lord has done in Kazakhstan, and praise Him for all He will yet do!
