HONG KONG UPDATE

Hong Kong, known as the Pearl of the Orient, is located on China's southern coast and covers 426 square miles, an area which is about a quarter of the size of the state of Rhode Island. Of the 7.2 million people who live there, 95 percent of Hong Kong's residents are ethnic Chinese whose main religious beliefs include predominately: Confucianism, Buddhism, and Taoism with a mix of folk religious practices, and ancestor veneration. On February 19th, a team of four from Faith: Pastor Baumann, Bob Green, Nick Hill, and Nick's son Ethan Hill, will leave to journey to Hong Kong to serve as a short-term

mission team and will return to the United State on March 2nd. A second team from South Dakota and Wisconsin will be going to Hong Kong in April. That team will be considerably larger, perhaps in the neighborhood of 20-25 individuals. We praise God for the possibility of being able to send Toni Kenefick-Aschoff from our congregation as a mission team member with the April Hong Kong group as she has expressed great interest in being able to go back to Hong Kong for a second time. Your continued support for her participation in going back is such a blessing and so very appreciated.

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR URBACH

Greetings to you in the Christ child!

First of all, I thank you for all the Christmas cards, they contained wonderful thoughts and many of them thoughtful gifts. I have been overwhelmed in these 39 Christmases by your kindness. So thank you so very, very much!

There are parts of a pending retirement that I feel I will welcome and other parts, like a 39 year run of Christmas Eve preaching that I will deeply miss. I try not to ponder this too deeply as it makes my heart feel heavy. Yet it has been a joyful heart lifting joy to have preached to God's people at Faith for 39 joyful Christmas Eves.

At our Thanksgiving Day worship, the Epistle lesson of Philippians Chapter 1, became emotional words for me.

"I thank my God every time I remember you. It is right for me to feel this way about all of you, since I have you in my heart; And this is my prayer: That your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth and insight, so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless until the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ—to the glory and praise of God."


Well, thanks again for all the Christmas thoughtfulness. You are a loving, kind, and generous people.

"IN THE KNOW AT FAITH LUTHERAN ... "

One of our favorite songs to sing during 2nd to 8th grade Midweek music is a song by Graham Kendrick entitled: "Knowing You." The words beautifully capture the life we desire as Christians, a life that continually seeks to know Jesus Christ, and to make Him known. The words are as follows: "Knowing You, Jesus, knowing You, there is no greater thing... You're my all, You're the best, You're my joy, my righteousness, and I love you Lord." I tell you, it gives me goose-bumps to hear a hundred young students sing their little hearts out to that song during Midweek music time. That's my desire as a pastor, that not only our young people, myself included, but everyone we touch with the Gospel, would continue to grow in, and know the power of Christ and His risen life. When we encounter Jesus, when we know Him as He is fully known... It is incredible!...It is life changing! Jesus doesn't leave us where He found us, that the Scriptures make clear. It is exciting to be in a loving relationship with the Savior of the world who conquered death, in a relationship with the One who forgives you, with the One who accepts you, lovingly sees you in your sin-sickness, brokenness, and despair, and who rescues you. Yes! It is this Jesus who is our best. He is our champion! He is our full and complete joy as Christians and we would desire to not just know about Him, but to earnestly know Him more.

"...You're my all, You're the best..." Don't be fooled by a world that tells you it can offer you the best. Money—not the best. Come and go relationships—not the best. Pick and choose your own philosophy and your own religion off the buffet menu—not the best. Monumental independence and enormous personal achievement-not.... the.... best! These are all fool's gold. A life lived securely in the knowledge, care, forgiveness, and love of Jesus Christ-the best! Absolutely the best! A life lived serving others, and following the God given path He has laid out for you as a husband / wife / student / nurse / employer / mom / dad / rancher / farmer / etc.--that's the best. Wherever we are in life, we can give God our best because He is The Best and He's given Himself to us!

"You're my joy, my righteousness, and I love you Lord." I would share with you that I am not a pastor because of some profound or miraculous event, or because of some deal I made with God, or because I am more special than anyone else. No, I felt the internal call to be a pastor because the love of Jesus pressed itself upon me in my baptism and in the course of my upbringing as a young boy. I felt the Holy Spirit's tug as I was encouraged and nurtured in the Christian faith by faithful parents, faithful teachers, faithful pastors. My dad faithfully brought me to Sunday school each and every week. It was very rare, perhaps non-existent that we missed a Sunday worship service at St. Stephen's in little old Batavia, Wisconsin. I attended confirmation classes from 6th to 8th grade not once, but twice a week! My parents put me in a Lutheran grade school, and into a Lutheran high school in Sheboygan, Wisconsin. Desiring to know Jesus even more and grow in His love, I continued my journey to Concordia Mequon at our Lutheran University there for my undergraduate degree, and then by God's grace went on to

Concordia Seminary in St. Louis for pastoral training. The thing about Jesus' unending and eternal love for you, is that once you taste it, you're going to chase it as far as you possibly can into places and situations you never pictured yourself in. The cross Jesus bore for you and for me, it changes absolutely everything. It's a love unlike any other. It grips us, holds us, and never lets us go. Knowing Jesus is the difference maker. This Jesus is God's answer to sin, death, and the devil. His cross, His empty grave means our sins are atoned for, our empty grave secured. My journey as a pastor is one way I follow Jesus, yours is another. A life spent following Jesus, becomes shaped and molded to be more like His. And yet, following Jesus is not a glamorous life. In fact, it's a tough journey to be a follower of Christ in today's world, especially as Christ caring people who know Him and who make Him known, but it's ours as Christians. It's your journey this day as well. What a great privilege to know God and to be known by Him, to love Him and to be loved by Him, all because He first loved us.

God's rich blessings to you as you desire to know the Savior even more this year through Word, worship, and receiving the sacrament of Holy Communion with fellow believers. Don't just know about Him, but know Him all the more personally and deeply in this upcoming year.

His leading and direction with our congregation and district involvement in short-term mission teams overseas, especially to Hong Kong. Currently, our February team has secured their plane tickets with flights out of Pierre, Denver, and San Francisco which we praise God for. The plane tickets are a major cost of the trip (about \$1400), with costs still remaining for in-country fees of about \$500 a person. Nick Hill is also working to compose a printed keepsake to give to the Hong Kong students in the form of a "love letter from God" on nicely printed paper which they will be able to have as their own. To help defray some of those fees our team still has, we will be hosting a free-will oatmeal breakfast on January 5th which we hope to have you be a part of. It is exciting to think about the new connections God will give us and the opportunities to let Jesus shine through our
