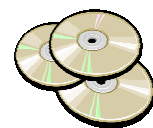

“Will Someone Please Think of the Children?”

Proverbs 4:20-23 NIV “My son, pay attention to what I say; listen closely to my words. Do not let them out of your sight, keep them within your heart; for they are life to those who find them and health to a man’s whole body. Above all else, guard your heart, for it is the wellspring of life.”

I have the unique privilege and joy of centering my life’s work on loving, leading, and listening to children here at Faith Lutheran Church. There are literally hundreds and hundreds of children that I interact with on a weekly basis. And to all our wonderful daycare, pre-school, Sunday school, midweek, J.Y.M., L.Y.F., young adult, and baptismal families... thank you for the joyful opportunities you afford to me as I interact with your children as we worship, love, and serve Jesus, our Savior, together. It is a privilege of mine to get to know each child and youth, and to share Christ with them, which is what I love to do!

While my focus and emphasis in ministry seems to center on the children, that doesn’t always seem to be the case as I read the news, see the internet, and experience life where children aren’t always a priority. With everything happening in the world around us these days, I have to ask the age-old question: **“WILL SOMEONE PLEASE THINK OF THE CHILDREN?!!!!!!”** In such a crazy and volatile world, this sentiment comes to my mind more often than not. It makes my heart sad to think of all those things that happen to our children like: 100 Nigerian Christian girls kidnapped, deadly shootings at Sandy Hook Elementary School and in high schools around the country, divorce, gangs, bullying, rampant exposure to sexually explicit media and material, teen pregnancy, neglect, abuse, trafficking, the dissolving of one man and one woman model for marriage, and sadly the list goes on. I cringe at thinking about the environment the next generation of children will be entering and the problems that

will face them. I cringe at thinking about those things which my own children will have to face. I truly just want to exclaim: **“Will Someone Please Think of the Children!!!!”**

It’s not a bad question to ask. The writer of the book of Proverbs, King Solomon, addresses this question by using two remarkable words. Those two words are: “My son(s).” Over and over and over again in chapters 1-7 of Proverbs, King Solomon imparts wisdom to His sons, addressing them personally and specifically, exhorting them to live godly and upright lives in an age full of turmoil. He thinks of their futures and shares with them gleanings of insight and understanding which God has given to him as king. What an encouragement to dads to take up the role of spiritual head and leader within the household! Sometimes, well maybe frequently, we need to be saying, “Listen my son... Listen my daughter...” Parents, not only impart to your children the sound wisdom and teaching of the Bible, but **SPEND TIME WITH THEM!** Be an active part of their journey and upbringing. Don’t leave it all up to the church but take an active role side by side with the church as we partner together in the spiritual formation of our children. Model to them what a godly example and walk with Jesus looks like. If we reap what we sow in the lives of our children, may we be sowing the seeds of love, honesty, respect, reverence, purpose and devotion to Christ early on. Think of your children early and often. So I ask, **“Will Someone Please Think of the Children?”** And we find in the Bible that the answer is a resounding: **“YES!!!!”** God our heavenly Father has indeed thought of and remembered His children. In your sin, in your despair, God has thought of you! And not only has God just thought of you, He actually did something about it! God has sent His only Son, born of a woman, born under the Law, to redeem those under the Law, so that in Him we

might become the righteousness of God. And in the waters of your holy baptism God has made you His child and an heir of all His promises. God has done something about the mess of life we experience around us on a day to day basis. #1 God sent His Son to suffer, die, and rise so that we might dwell in this newness of life which is now, but not yet. #2 God made you alive in Christ Jesus in your baptism and recipient of all God’s promises! This means nothing can snatch you out of God’s hand. It’s our ultimate joy and comfort as His children. God has thought of us. We are no longer children of the devil, but children of God. And no matter what happens in this earthly life, **NOTHING** will be able to separate you from God’s love for you in Christ Jesus. You are His child and He loves you beyond imagination!

So this summer, I hope your children take advantage of all the opportunities they have to know they are loved at Faith Lutheran and by God Himself: VBS, JYM Volksmarch Trip, Circuit Bible Camp, Camp Minneboji, VeggieTales movie night, L.Y.F. on Wednesday evenings at 8, an L.Y.F. Concordia Trip, and other things which will happen throughout the summer. **“Will Someone Please Think of the Children?”** Yes, here at Faith Lutheran we do! And so does God our heavenly Father!

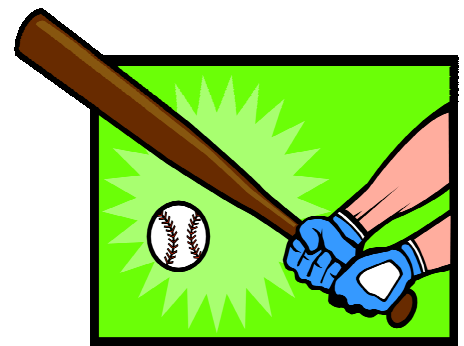

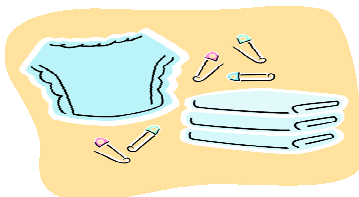


Diaper Derby

YOUTH NEWS

VBS IS HERE! – Our Vacation Bible School begins June 1st. If you still need to get your child registered for VBS last second, you can do so by going online to: www.faithluth.com and click on the “register online” tab or fill out a paper registration copy in the church office. VBS this year centers on a water theme and Jesus’ ministry around the Sea of Galilee. We kick off Sunday, June 1st at 6:00 p.m. and each night goes from 6:00-8:30 p.m. in the evenings. VBS ends on Thursday, June 5th. The theme of VBS will be: **Gangway to Galilee!** We will host Captive Free as they share the gift of Jesus with us through song, games, and puppets. Open for youth ages 4 through 6th grade (those having just completed 6th grade).

Captive Free – We have an amazing opportunity for life on life interaction between 5 Christian college aged adults from all over the country to spend time with our young high school youth. Pastor Baumann greatly encourages parents of High school and J.Y.M. youth to have their child here at Faith to meet Captive Free and hang out with them for an hour!
