“Empty”

John 3:30

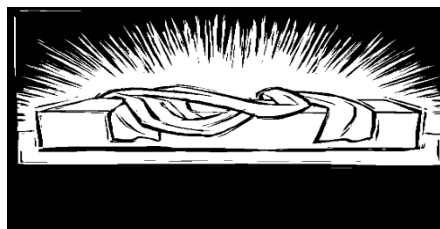
“He must become greater, I must become less.”

You might be surprised to hear, but I’ve had what I would call, some good “empty” moments this past summer. Typically we think of emptiness as a bad thing, but it doesn’t always have to be that way. What a joyous feeling it was when in July we made it to our Circuit Bible Camp campsite, and the trailer was completely empty from the kids taking all their gear out of it for us. Indeed, it was nice to see the trailer *empty*! And how good it was to see that the roasters were *empty* after we served a good National Youth Gathering breakfast. An *empty* office is a good thing, because it means I’m out and about traveling with our youth, the congregation, or family to some destination, or maybe even embarking on one of those world famous South Dakota pheasant hunts we’re so well known for. So there’s certainly a number of good forms of “empty” I am refreshed to see and experience.

And yet in the Christian journey there are undoubtedly those moments when we feel *empty* and dried up. King David writes about this feeling in Psalm 22, which we also know to be Messianic in nature as it points us to Christ. King David writes; *“My strength is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; you lay me in the dust of death.”*

Talk about being *empty*!

Ultimately this Psalm points us to the One who was completely emptied for us. Jesus- His life was *emptied* on the cross and strength *emptied* as he marched the hill to get there. He was laid in the dust of death. His dignity emptied. His life was *emptied* all for us. For those days and moments when you feel completely hollowed out and *empty*, drained by sin, like you’ve got nothing left, emptier than ever—just remember that the Son of God, Jesus Christ, was poured out unto death for you, because of love, poured out to fill you up with God’s love for you. On those hollow days, pray especially to the Lord; read your Bible, go fill someone else up, encourage, love, and serve! In your baptism, you are filled with all the promises of Jesus Christ whose death and resurrection guarantees them to you. The cross of Christ would be a sad and tragic story had death fully won. We know that the body of the Son of God was placed in a tomb, and that tomb was filled with the corpse of a dead Jesus. But three days later, the tomb was _____!!!!



YOU GOT IT!!! *EMPTY*!

And Jesus was made alive and lives and reigns to this day.

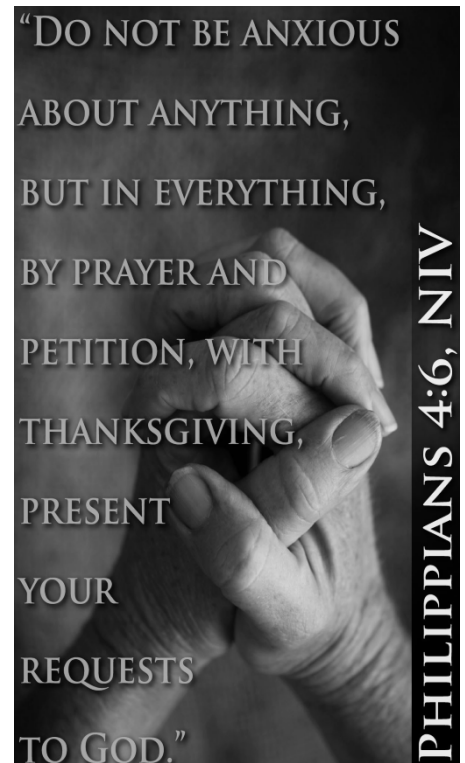
“So, pour us out, Oh

SPEAK TO ONE ANOTHER!

"Speak to one another with psalms, hymns and spiritual songs. Sing and make music in your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." Ephesians 5: 19, 20

Back in the day, in high school chorus, we were working on Jean Berger's fourth composition from his larger work, Devotional Songs, "Redet miteinander." Translated, that means, "Speak to One Another." Although the English text was also provided, our director was insistent that it be sung in German. He felt, and he was probably right, that the music lost something in translation. Not only that, the music seemed to embrace the beauty of the German language. As high school students, we really had no appreciation for that kind of thinking. Throughout the song, the phrase, "redet miteinander" was repeated over and over, and I was so busy focusing on the German diction, without tripping over my tongue, that the true meaning of the text completely escaped me. At that time in my life, I didn't make the connection to the above passage from Ephesians.

St. Paul exhorts and urges us

to edify one another by songs of praise. It is an imperative sentence; a direct command, and a matter of obligation for Christians. Praise is an important part of worship, and designed to be so to the end of the world. Our hymns and songs should illustrate what the Spirit-filled life is: Fruitful, active, understanding, joyful, thankful and submissive, as well as bold in witnessing. Hymns and psalms and liturgy allow us to worship. I can think of many hymns learned and sung over my lifetime that I can make a connection to where I was, or what I was doing at the time – the first hymn I ever memorized, my confirmation hymn, a hymn from the funeral of a loved one. Wouldn't it be interesting to create a playlist of hymns from our lives?

The Bible is full of beautiful words and poetry, full of mystery, and full of metaphor. Well-written hymns help us worship, because they, too, are full of mystery and metaphor, and provide the message and healing balm of God's saving grace. The texts are just as relevant centuries after they were written, because every last one of us shares the reality of being troubled, and having brokenness, sin, and death in our

lives. I would venture a guess that most of us sometimes also try and free ourselves with an array of human-created concoctions. Hymns can help us find the freedom in God's saving grace and the promise of resurrection.

Breathe, O breathe Thy loving
Spirit

Into every troubled breast.

Let us all in Thee inherit;

Let us find Thy promised rest.

Take away the love of sinning,

Alpha and Omega be;

End of faith as its beginning.

Set our hearts at liberty.

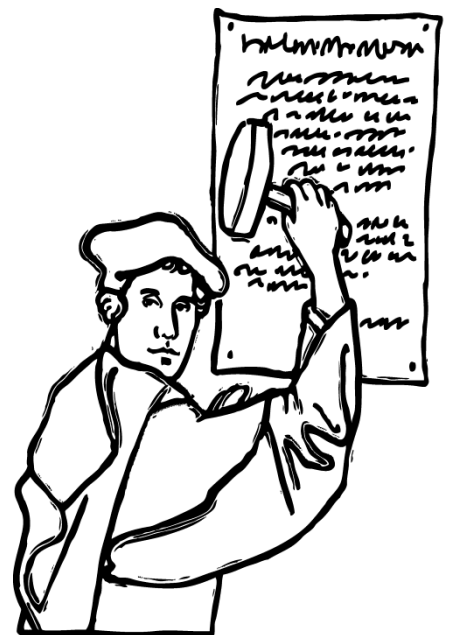

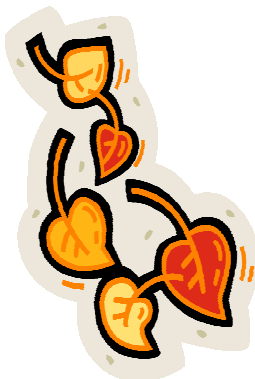
