Who's doing what? Part two

Continuing on from last month, with a review of what groups and boards at church do what, I continue to get two mixed up with great regularity. I will mention them first.

The Board of Education works with educational programs of the church like Sunday School, Midweek, and Adult Bible classes. It sounds easy, but it is so not easy. Time is spent recruiting, thanking, and supporting others who work in this area at Faith.

The Board of Early Education oversees and directs the Pre-school and Day Care at faith. They deal with funding, personnel issues, policies, and also take a long range view to increase the programs and develop them into the future.

The Board of Missions and Evangelism does formal Gospel outreach beyond the bounds of the congregation. They sponsor Compassion Sunday, coordinate the mission trips to Hong Kong, and spearhead the ice water distribution for the bikers.

The Elders help with church services, both regular and special by helping distribute communion, reading lessons, and being present to help. They also work with the pastors to keep things headed the right directions.

In addition to meeting as boards, for the past months, each board has been able to send members to talk with the other boards at council meetings, which are held monthly. These meetings help to keep the other boards abreast of what is going on with others, and serves as catalyst for ideas and concerns that might not otherwise rise.

I encourage you to pray for the members of these boards, and ask you too to do one thing if you are planning to use the church facilities for a group or personal event. Please stop in the office to get and then sign a Christian Family Life Center (gym) Use Agreement. This greatly helps communication on expectations and dates. There is no rental fee but contributions to offset use are welcome.

So, for now, that's all I know about that I didn't use to know about. I hope this helps you all too. And rest assured, there will be no test.

"Child and Beast Live in Christ's Peace"

The summer began with two very intense and tragic national stories involving young children and wild animals. First, the young boy who fell into the gorilla enclosure at the Cincinnati Zoo, made us all a little more aware of how quickly children can become misplaced and how a good situation can become frantically desperate. Fortunately, the child lived in this instance, and unfortunately the 400-pound beloved Silverback Gorilla died. We can all picture in our minds the helplessness we'd feel if it was our child who was in the clutches of life threatening danger. The second instance of children and wild animals was one that ended in deep tragedy with a little boy being snatched from his parents by an alligator while at a resort in Orlando. The 2 year-old drown after being dragged by the gator into the water, and understandably, the family was stricken with unimaginable grief at the death of their toddler.

Both of these stories demonstrate the stark contrast of Isaiah's passage in Isaiah 11, "The wolf will live with the lamb, the leopard will lie down with the goat, the calf and the lion and the yearling together; and a little child will lead them. The cow will feed with the bear, their young will lie down together, and the lion will eat straw like the ox. The infant will play near the hole of the cobra, and the young child will put his hand into the viper's nest. They will neither harm nor destroy on all my holy mountain, says the LORD." Not only do we wrestle with lack of peace between individuals and different people groups, but if that wasn't bad enough, peace is even absent in creation and the animal kingdom also because of the fatal curse of sin. It doesn't take long to see that something in creation is amiss. Yet Isaiah paints this beautiful picture of what happens when the Prince of Peace comes to extend His

rule. In Isaiah 9, we get the prophecy of One who is coming who will be Wonderful, Mighty, Everlasting, and The Prince of Peace. Jesus the Christ is our Prince of Peace and the peace needed for all of creation. He is the catalyst for God's plan to bring ultimate peace to you and to restore creation in perfect peace back to the original design of Eden.

How have you seen the brokenness of creation around you? Floods, fires, tornadoes....? These all testify that there is a longing for restoration and peace. Sure, it is good to be in the cathedral of creation and to worship God there, but that's not where we fully know God. That's not the primary place where God's people worship Him. Creation can betray our knowledge of God because it is broken. You're on the golf course, or on the river, and you look up into the sky and feel a love from God because His creation is so peaceful, but the next day this same creation causes a tornado to devastate your house and everything you own, and suddenly you begin to doubt and question God, when hours before this very same creation was what seemed to confirm God's love for you. Do you see the false thinking that we can trust creation to know the salvation and love of God? The only true peace and affirmation we have is that of Jesus' shedding of His blood on the cross, marking the way for peace in this Pastor Baumann world. We worship God for this life giving peace on Sundays in the Divine Service. If we've been missing you; PLEASE, PLEASE come back to the Lord's house I beg you! Because it is the only place where you will truly know peace in this world. First, we have peace with God because of Jesus' death for us, and secondly, even at Je-

sus' death you recall creation reacting. In Matthew 27 and Luke 23 we are told at Jesus' crucifixion there was darkness over the whole land, and that the earth shook and rocks split. The one who commanded control over the wind and the waves with his voice, surely had his voice silenced in death, and yet even creation couldn't keep silent about the devastating news of Jesus' death. Our hope, our only hope, even in the wake of deeply disturbing events around us, is that Jesus is going to fully and finally usher in His reign and rule of peace. Death, the Devil, and sin will be kicked out of creation in the New Heavens and the New Earth forever. It's a now promise, but not fully yet one. We faithfully await that day and the unfolding of God's full and complete plan of restoration when Christ returns in glory.

May you rest in the peace of God which passes all understanding, may you be a beacon of Christ's peace to the world around you, and may you faithfully await that day when peace prevails and when even child and animal will dwell together in peace. The Lord be with you!

In addition to the over 20 volunteer workers and countless sewers for our kits, Carol Harrmann and Jeri Erbe independently collected pillowcases and sewed dresses. Working throughout the year they created 128 dresses as their personal mission and support for Little Dresses. This year a total of 327 dresses were completed and sent to girls giving them hope and touching their lives. The do-athome kits are available for anyone to sew and add their own creative designs. New dresses are displayed on the Narthex wall about every 2 weeks from February through April.

Little Dresses for Africa is a Christian organization reaching over 47 African countries, 31 other countries and even the Appalachians and South Dakota in the USA. Mission teams from the United States personally deliver a majority of the dresses to churches, orphanages and schools giving hope in the name of Jesus.


LWML August Fun Night


Who are we? We are a group of busy "Seniors" mostly retired who gather once a month for a fine meal and great conversation!
