A Message from our Interim Pastor

Interim. An in-between time. The Bible is full of interims. Jesus left his disciples to pray and they decided to have a rest interim. Meanwhile Judas was having a 'get ready to arrest' Jesus interim. Oftentimes the Bible doesn't tell us much about what happened during the interim times. What exactly did Jesus do between being buried and talking to the women on Easter morning? We have some glimpses, but no real for sures

Of course to induce headaches, we might just say that all of life is in interim. We're between death and life, between meals, between thoughts, between vesterday and tomorrow. Well, let's just stop. You get the idea. God is a God who is always with us in between things.

Then there is being intentional. Sometimes things just happen, and we Christians may see the hand of grace behind it all and call it providence. I do kind of think the disciples likely put the whole Palm Sunday event down to providence. Lazarus had been raised and so a bunch of those sight-seers were out and swarming, while Jesus came into town and the noise built until the people in the city heard the noise and came out to see what was all up. Voila! Parade of scattered garments and palm branches. Nice, but not intentional from

their view.

Going to Jerusalem that year, however, THAT was intentional. They'd argued. They'd pointed out the danger. Jesus was determined. At last they decided that if he wanted to risk his hide, they would risk theirs too. That was intentional.

Lent is intentional for us. We decide to do it. We could just do Easter. But setting the time apart for Lent makes Easter better, and so we intend to keep Lent. Each year the same, each year different. Our expectations are not always met 100%. Some years they are barely met at all. Even with the best intentions. But knowing God and trusting his leading we learn new things each time we relive the suffering and the kindness of Christ.

This year at Faith Lutheran Church Lent has also been a time for beginning another intentional interim. This one in the life of the congregation. It is a time between, a time to rethink, keep going, and look at things in a different light. This might (or might not) involve seven areas:

--to work through transition emotions that usually follow of the congregation and previous pastor/member relationships.

--to discover the congregations special identity and what it dreams of being and doing.


--to deal with shifts in professional and lay leadership that inevitably occur in times of transition.

--to strengthen the congregation's relationship with District and Synod, considering and using the available resources and the mutual responsibilities involved

--to develop a commitment to the anticipated leadership of a new pastor with the possibilities the future will bring.

Of course, the Lord has this all planned out. But like most Biblical interim times, even as congregational leaders properly set out to be intentional, the Lord will work in ways wonderful, unexpected, and often unseen. He is the Lord of the Church.

What's Next?

It doesn't take us long in our lives to come up with that one particular question we all want to know. Oh, you've certainly asked it I'm sure a time or two before. We all want to know: "What's next?"

It's the perfect question to ask when you're bored with life and life's circumstances. Kids ask it all the time! As many of you know, this has been a fundraiser for different things.


- Our first year, we were blessed enough to go to Hong Kong.

Life Team News—March, 2016

CREATED-REDEEMED-CALLED

January 22, 2016 marked the 43rd anniversary of the landmark US Supreme Court decision known as Roe vs. Wade, which legalized abortion in the United States. In somber reflection of the over 56 million human lives lost to abortion since 1973, and in reverent gratitude for our Savior, Jesus Christ, Who has created, redeemed and called each one of us because He loves human life, Faith Lutheran congregation observed Life Sunday on January 24, 2016. Thank you to those who stopped by the Life Team information table that day to learn more about what it means to be a "For Life" Lutheran. Many of Faith's members enjoyed refreshments that day provided by the Faith Life Team, and joined in the Life Sunday Bible Study entitled "Created, Redeemed and Called." Thank you to Pastor Baumann for leading that life-affirming study. The Life Team also made presentations to the Sunday School classes on Sunday, January 17 and gave the students Scriptural reminders that the God who created and redeemed them wants them to respect human life at all stages.

RESPONDING TO THE PLANNED PARENTHOOD VIDEOS

2015 was a significant year in the pro-life movement as it saw the release of 11 disturbing videos that uncovered the heinous acts of Planned Parenthood in the procurement and illegal sale of human baby parts. In the aftermath of the videos, which were widely-circulated in major news outlets and on social media, many thousands of outraged individuals and prolife groups, including our own LCMS synodical president, Rev. Matthew Harrison and the national director of Lutherans for Life, Rev. James Lamb, called on Congress to defund Planned Parenthood, our nation's leading abortion provider. And yet, many people, including some presidential candidates, have stood firm in their support of Planned Parenthood as a major provider of women's health services. When considering this situation, here are some important facts to keep in mind:

In 2014, Planned Parenthood received \$528 million in taxpayer funding. With that, this so-called non-profit organization operated fewer than 700 clinics that provided services to fewer than 3 million women, including 378,692 pap tests; zero mammograms; and 327,653 abortions. In contrast, there are over 9,000 Community Health Centers operating in the US that served over 21 million women, providing 1,787,256 pap tests; 424,376 mammograms; and zero abortions. Where would you rather see your tax dollars go: to Planned Parenthood, or to a Community Health Center? 
