I make them, you make them, and everyone makes them. Assumptions. The only person I can think of who does not do the “assume game,” is God. The God of the Bible is quite direct, unassuming, and trusting.

As interim pastor I have so much appreciated those who have told me things, let me know things, and given me background on things. Any person new to Faith would likewise need help learning the ropes. I have also found myself assuming things, or having others assume things for or about me. Those times tend to be more upsetting, painful, and worrisome.

These more upsetting times can be shortened greatly by checking, asking, (and sometimes asking again), and listening. People who used to do x, may no longer want to. Others who never thought they would be able to do y, find themselves having the itch to give it a go.

All of this is part of life. And of following the Life. As mental and physical beings, growth stops. As spiritual beings, growth is possible at any stage of life, and to any degree. It has to be. We are constantly changing beings. God knows that. He made us, after all. And he knows we are happiest when our ever changing beings are close to Him.

This interim is a time of growth

for Faith congregation. Of learning new ways to do things, of discovering new feelings, of expressing old meanings in ways that better touch our neighbors each day we leave the house. Assumptions break down when people grow.

So, we follow the Way, the Truth, and the LIFE. Assumptions can lessen, and new ways, new truths, and new lives spring up and grow. Because any church of Jesus is living. It is how He makes us.

--Vice President—steps in for the president as needed. Bill Bossman.

--Secretary—records the official minutes for council and voters meetings. Cindy Fredrich.

--Treasurer—disburses submitted congregational bills, oversees payroll, and records it all. Beth King.

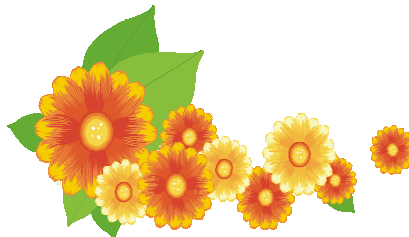

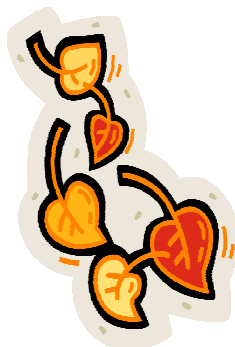

Debt Retirement

Once again—your gifts to Debt Retirement made it possible for us to make an additional Debt Retirement payment.

Thus Far—

- We have made 166 advance payments
- We have saved \$561,451.77 in interest
- Our balance on our \$1,000,000 loan has been reduced to \$384,935.16



Yes, it is the tipping of the scales, we have now saved more on interest than what our principal balance is.

Remarkable! Yes it is. We started accelerated payments immediately with our first payment on July 1, 2010.

Music is an inherent part of every society. From the earthy sounds of Mongolia and Siberia, to the importance of Bach in European society, to drum-driven song and dance in Native American culture, music is an important part of life. It is not surprising that the Bible says much about it. In fact, the longest book in the Bible is its song book – Psalms.

The musician Jubal was already mentioned in the book of Genesis. References to music are recorded in Exodus, Deuteronomy, Judges and I Samuel. Two of the Old Testament's most important figures wrote songs: Moses and David. Music was used in conjunction with coronations, feasts and events in the royal court. Two of the Gospels indicate that Jesus and his disciples sang a hymn at the end of the Last Supper. Paul gave instructions regarding the use of music during Christian gatherings.

The above song is one of deliverance. Not only does it recall Moses and the Israelites proceeding through the Red Sea waters, but also the fact that the risen Lord triumphed over his enemies, securing deliverance for his followers. I would like to imagine that is the one song we will sing forever in eternity.

I ran across a quote the other day that caught my attention: *"Music is God's gift to man, the only art of Heaven given to earth; the only art of earth*

Both the Old and New Testaments strongly support the use of music during worship. The extensive anthology of actual songs found in the Old Testament indicates the value that God places on creative musical expression. Music in worship today is valuable and honors God in a special way. It is also rehearsal for heaven. The simple
