A MIGHTY FORTRESS

"God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."

Psalm 46:1

As you may or may not know, this year marks the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. The Protestant Reformation occurred in 1517, and was initiated by Martin Luther and the Reformers as they clung to the Word of God and took refuge in it. Their aim in sparking what would later be known as The Protestant Reformation, was to take a stand on the pure Word of God against threats and punishment, and to correct errors and false teachings that were taking place in the church. The Guttenberg Printing Press, which was revolutionary technology for that day, greatly helped to further the transmission of the Scriptures, which Luther translated into common German for the people. This was remarkable in that it placed the Scriptures in the peoples' hands. The press also helped to further Luther's teaching and writings drawn from Scripture. Through the Reformation, Luther helped illuminate errors in the church's teachings and point people back to the Scriptures and the strong truth of God's Word. One thing Dr. Luther taught and advocated for was something called: "The Three Estates," or three "walls" if you will, which protected the conscience and preserved God's good and right order of things in the heart and life of the Christian follower. The 3 estates were: the family, the church,

and the government. When those three God-given "fortress walls" are rightly ordered and doing what they need to be doing, the world is blessed and evil is held in check so that the good of all society is promoted in a God-pleasing way. When one of those walls is penetrated, and broken down, as secular society has continually been seeking to do, the enemy has easy access to disrupt and destroy faith, the family unit, Biblical marriage between one man and one woman, and ultimately obedience to the Word of God. The Reformation was so practical in so many ways!

In observance of this historical event in the life of the Church, there are going to be a number of opportunities to commemorate an anniversary date that will occur only once in our lifetimes. In late October, Saturday Oct. 28th and Sunday, October 29th to be exact, there will be a special circuit-wide Reformation service held in Pierre along with a Reformation blowout bash complete with: a Potluck meal (We're Lutheran! Potlucks are a must-have... and don't forget the Jell-O either!), a special afternoon worship service on that Sunday, guest preacher-Rev. President Scott Sailer, and guest Hispanic musical group called Mariachi San Pablo from El Paso, Texas. More on that to come!

But what is going to be really special for the kids, youth of the community, and congregation before the October date will be this year's Vacation Bible School entitled: Mighty Fortress; In Jesus, the Victory is Won!

All this to point us back to the beneficial work of Martin Luther in the Reformation and to the pure Word of God given to us by grace through faith in Christ Iesus. WRITE ABOUT MUSIC

"Serve the Lord with gladness; come before His presence with Singing." Psalm 100:2

That part of the month comes around faster than one would think. Pastor Rajek concurred. I sighed and said, "What am I going to write about...." Pastor Rajek said, "Write about music."

I enjoy writing. I never minded having to write papers all through high school and college. I wrote for the school newspaper. Essay exams never bothered me either. But, almost always, I was given a specific topic. Granted, music is a specific topic, but it covers a lot of ground, and I always struggle for something to say. That's probably why I wait until the last minute to come up with something.

So I headed home. It's been a busy week with a number of rehearsals at school and a couple of concerts scheduled. I needed to get my music organized. An hour later I was looking for binder clips and digging through a bookshelf drawer that sits next to my piano. There it was: A little framed Bible verse, "Serve the Lord with gladness; come before His presence with Singing." It had been a Christmas gift, given to me in 1999 by Vicar Cory Rajek. Well, I can take a hint!

The psalmist is saying that it is a privilege and duty to be happy in our religious worship and all of our acts of obedience. In other words, serving God should not be done with reluctance, grudgingly, or as a matter of compulsion; it should be freely rendered. The service of God is a source of the highest joy that man knows. In the same verse, thereby highlighting its importance, the psalmist states that singing is an expression of joy. After all, nature rejoices and the birds sing. Man should as well. We are called to praise God because of our indebtedness to him.

That being said, I would like to recognize those who sing as part of their ministry among our congregation – the choir, praise team, soloists and the Sunday school and midweek students. Weekly rehearsals and Sunday morning music offerings take a special kind of commitment. It's time that is set aside and competes with so many other activities and interests. 

Little Dresses for Africa

Little Dresses for Africa is a mission outreach of Faith Lutheran LWML. Starting in February about a dozen volunteers meet Monday evenings of one afternoon a week to cut pillowcases and assemble kits to be sewn into dresses. The do-at-home kits are sewn by Faith members, coworkers and friends.

Many people have supported this project. Gently used pillowcases, laces, trims. Buttons, an iron, ironing board, and money were donated by church members, friends and relatives throughout the United States. Marilyn Penrod helped assemble kits Thursday afternoons and stitched over 100 kits. Carol Harrman and Jeri Erbe independently collected pillowcases and sewed over 60 dresses. This year a total of 362 dresses were completed. New dresses are displayed on the narthex wall from February through April.

Little Dresses for Africa is a Christian organization reaching over 83 countries including Africa, disaster areas, the Appalachians and South Dakota. The non-profit organization was founded in 2008. Since 2009 the LWML has contributed 1,367 dresses. Mission teams from the United States personally deliver the dresses to churches, orphanages and schools giving hope in the name of Jesus. The dresses serve as ambassadors that offer a way into homes or villages where LDFA volunteers teach simple lessons about clean water, primary education, basic health and community skills that make a difference in the lives of thousands of children. You have touched the lives of little girls and given them hope one little dress at a time.
