The Dead in Christ

"Rejoice that your names are written in heaven" (Luke 10:20). We have confidence in our eternal salvation through Jesus. In his death and resurrection, Christ has obtained forgiveness and eternal life for all who trust in him. Our time in this world will come to a conclusion of sorts in our own death. Yet, because Christ has risen from the dead, we look forward to the day of our resurrection. As family members and friends die, we put our hope in the promise of Jesus that his people will rise from death.

Every year, on All Saints' Day, we take time in our worship to remember those who have died within the past year. God blessed them with many gifts during their life. We take our greatest comfort knowing that faith was one of their treasured possessions. The names of the "Dead in Christ" are also written in a book that we place on the altar as part of our All Saints' Day observance: "The Book of the Names of the Dead."

Those members here at Faith who have died within the past year will have their names written in the book. This year, I want to open the book to all of you to write names of people in your lives who have died within the last year (since November 2023). The idea is to collect and remember the people that God placed in our lives who are temporarily separated from us by death.

"The Book of the Names of the Dead" will be on the Living Room table throughout the month of October. Please use that time to write down the names of people in your life who have died within the past year. I would prefer to include only people who have expressed their faith in Jesus. This book is intended to be a growing list of God's faithful people with whom we will be reunited on the day of the resurrection.

During our All Saints' Day worship on November 3, we will thank God for the gifts of life and faith that he gave to all the people in our book as well as to all his faithful people who are at rest in Jesus. We will individually list the members of our church and include a moment of silence for each one of them. As you remember their names and see their pictures, I want you to look forward to being able to see those faces, speak those names, and rejoice in the gift of unending life made possible through our Savior Jesus Christ.

THE SEASON OF TREES

"He is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither. Whatever he does prospers." Psalm 1:3

When I first moved to Pierre in 1973, I missed the trees. I grew up in a rural area of Minnesota -farm land, lakes and... trees. Lots of trees; and the further north one ventured, there were more trees and... forests! Grand Portage State Forest, Superior National Forest, and more. Beautiful trees and woodlands. Every farm had a grove of trees, and the lakes were surrounded by trees. One couldn't but help think about God's creation. They were part of our lives.

There were lots of trees in our neighborhood. Behind the house was our garden, and right next to it was our neighbor's garden. The alley, which ran along the edge of the gardens, was lined with evergreen trees, planted before my folks ever built their home. The trees are still there, towering over the highline wires, and standing sentinel over the neighborhood, while offering protection from the cold north wind. My folks planted a beautiful maple in the front yard, and in late fall, its gorgeous red-gold leaves would eventually drop into piles on the driveway. Dad also planted a weeping willow in the front yard, from a tiny little shoot. We kids used to jump over it when we thought our folks weren't watching. It didn't seem to stunt its growth, however, because it grew tall and proud -- so much so, it eventually had to be taken down. After I left home, Dad planted a flowering crab, which has produced a riot of color every spring. The old basswood tree is still on the corner -- sturdy and huge. It actually protected my brother's car during a hailstorm earlier in August.



The seasons change, the life tree blossoms, each young leaf nourished from above, holding on through trial and tempest, assuring us our legacy will live on.

Trees appear often in the Bible. They are part of the creation story. We read of the Cedars of Lebanon, olive trees, fig trees, palm trees and more. In Genesis, Joseph is compared to a tree -- a fruitful vine with branches. Jeremiah likens a man who trusts in the Lord to a tree planted by water and sends out its roots by the stream. Isaiah provides a physical description of the Messiah as a tender shoot, the "stump of Jesse." Perhaps best known is when God placed Adam in the Garden of Eden to care for it, but was warned not to eat from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil. We all know what happened to Adam, and because of his failure, it was probably a good thing the trees provided leaves for him and his wife!

We grow and change, we plant and harvest; in time each leaf comes tumbling down. Dust to dust, ashes to ashes, in Christ reborn, our legacy will live on.

Trees teach us about the nature of God. Like a tree, God is constantly giving life, beauty, food and shade. We often refer to Jesus' cross as a tree. Trees, like God, give life -- even after death. Where would we be without the wood that is used for warmth, and in building our homes and more? When John saw heaven, there was the water of life, a river flowing from the throne of God, and on each side of the river stood the tree of life. Quoting John in Revelation 22:14, "Blessed are those who wash their robes, that they may have the right to the tree of life and may go through the gates into the city."

"I am the vine; you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing." John 15:5








Men's Fellowship
